The Mid-Valley Quilt Guild welcomes you to the MVQG Quilt Camp at Scottish Rite Center on **Friday and Saturday, May 17 & 18, 2024.**

Quilt Camp is offering 21 different workshops on a variety of topics. You could learn about color and fabric choices in a quilt, how to use the colors of a single fabric in your appliqué or do a small project to learn about wool appliqué or crumb quilting. Other small projects offered are a name tag holder, greeting cards, mug rug or a table runner and a burrito pillowcase. There will be opportunities to make different types of bags and start quilts using multiple quilt patterns.

## CLASS # 1

### Quartered Stripes Quilt

Friday, Session 1

#### Class Description:

Out of 1 1/4<sup>th</sup> yards of striped fabric you can make this charming little quilt. It must be a stripe.

1. 1 ¼ yards of striped fabric. If you want to add borders like I did on the green and black one, buy 1 ½ yds. \*\*\* the better the quality of fabric, you'll have more success having your stripes match.
2. Thread to match.
3. Sharp cutter
4. 6" x 24" ruler
5. 12" square ruler if you have one (I will bring mine and we can share)
6. \*\*\*To be a step ahead, make sure your fabric is nice and straight on the top and bottom. Then open your fabric and press it so it is nice and flat. Fold it in half the other way and bring it to class that way. Don't press folds in it yet.

**Supply List:**

- You can use 3-4 coordinating fabrics; fat quarters OR scraps that measure at least 12"X18"
- If you want to fussy cut a small print for the center square on the front you will need 1 ½" square set on point such as a bird, squirrel, house etc.
- A 2 ½" square to set off fussy cut.
- 1 yard of rat tail cording or up to ¼" cording.
- Thread to match especially binding fabric and #8 pearl cotton to help frame fussy cut.
- Sewing machine, small cutting mat, and rotary cutter. 12" ruler, scissors, seam ripper and other basic sewing supplies.
- Assortment of hand sewing and embroidery needles
- Enameled collector pins (can be added later)
- Assortment of small buttons, beads, and charms to decorate (these can also be added later)

In this class you will be making fabric to be used in the construction of a scissor case. You will also see examples of how this technique can be used in making quilt blocks. If time allows, there will be plenty of crumbs for you to play with and create additional crumb fabric.

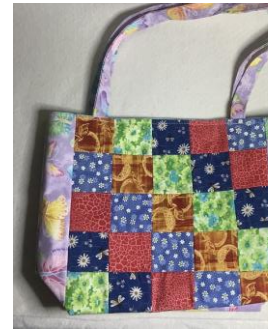

- Bag Bottom and handles: 1 yard.
- Bag lining:  $\frac{3}{4}$  yard.
- Pockets on outside of bag:  $\frac{1}{4}$  yard
- Medium weight interfacing: (Shape-Flex is suggested) 5 yards – Teacher will bring a bolt to class for purchase @ \$4.00 a yard.
- 1 – 18" or longer nylon zipper to match Main bag body fabric
- \*\*\* This is the yardage recommended on the pattern, but you may want to purchase just a little bit more than what the pattern calls for in case any cutting mistakes are made. Or bring some back up fabric just in case.
