
Requirements: Northcott Sesquicentennial Collection: Fat eighth each of 21341-110 (cream), 21341-34 (gold), 21341-49 (blue), 21341-11 (beige) and 21341-24 (red) 0.3 m Steam-A-Seam II Lite

Cutting Chart (Note: All measurements are height x width; number of pieces to cut is in parentheses. It's a good idea to label your pieces as you cut.)

Sewing Instructions (Note: All seam allowances are ¼", except where noted)

- 1. Collect the cut pieces for each unit, and keep them organized.
- 2. Where required (crown of hat, face, and tunic units), you will need to angle some corners. To do this, take the two square cream pieces for each unit and draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each piece. Place them as shown in the diagram on two corners of the corresponding unit piece (gold for crown of hat, beige for face, red for tunic), and sew directly on the line. Press the cream fabric towards the corner and trim away the excess seam allowance.



- 3. Assemble each unit according to the diagram and picture on the next page and sew the units together. Your block will measure 12½" x 18½".
- 4. Trace the sash, epaulettes, buttons, and moustache (choose your favourite!) onto the gridded paper side of Steam-A-Seam II Lite. Following manufacturer's instructions and referring to picture, apply to wrong sides of appropriate fabrics and fuse to Mountie. Sew around raw edges with small zigzag, blanket stitch, or free-motion stitching.
- 5. Using triple straight stitch and referring to the picture, define sleeves on tunic.
- 6. Salute!
