

Freezer Paper Piecing: Tara Faughnan 2020

Learn how to create freezer paper foundations for precision piecing. This technique is similar to paper piecing, but foundations are reusable and there is no tearing out bits of paper afterwards! We will use the Diamonds quilt to learn the technique, and we will discuss how to apply it to many other patterns. In this class we will also look at the use of value and color to create visually complex quilts from the repetition of a simple block.

Level: Intermediate

Supply List:

Basic sewing supplies:

- Sewing machine
- Rotary cutter
- Acrylic rulers - long rectangle shape for drafting and small for trimming seam allowance
- Small cutting mat
- Pins
- Sewing machine needles
- Scissors
- Thread

Class Specific Supplies:

- Freezer paper
- Mechanical pencil and eraser
- Variety of PRE-WASHED fabrics. Bring enough color choices to suit your creative style. Pick fabrics you love with a variety of light and dark options.
- Pre-cut your fabrics 6" by WOF.
 - A 60" x 70" throw requires 6 1/2 to 7 yds.
 - A 24" x 25" mini requires 3/4-1 yd.
- Small portable design wall (40" by 40") I use an old piece of batting for this. This will enable you to work on the quilt layout in class and take it home in place.
- Mini iron and ironing board
- OPTIONAL: Add a Quarter ruler
- OPTIONAL: Mini iron and mini ironing board
- OPTIONAL- small 30"x 30" piece of batting to layout your design
