

# Blue Lagoon Quilt

Finished Size: 56" x 60"



## Supplies Needed

- Fabric Palette® Blue Lagoon Collection fabrics:
  - Gray Floral Medallion 2 Half Yards
  - Packed Medallions 1 Half Yard
  - Green Diamonds 1 Half Yard
  - Gray Damask 1 Half Yard
  - Blue Texture 1 Half Yard
  - White Lines 2 Fat Quarters
  - Blue Geo 1 Fat Quarter
  - Turq Damask 1 Fat Quarter
  - Leaves 1 Fat Quarter
  - Green Floral 1 Fat Quarter
- 3 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub> yards Coordinating fabric for backing and binding
- 60" x 66" Low loft batting
- Basting spray or safety pins
- Coordinating thread
- Rotary cutter, mat, and acrylic ruler
- Basic sewing supplies
- Sewing machine
- Even-feed foot
- Iron and pressing surface

## Before you begin

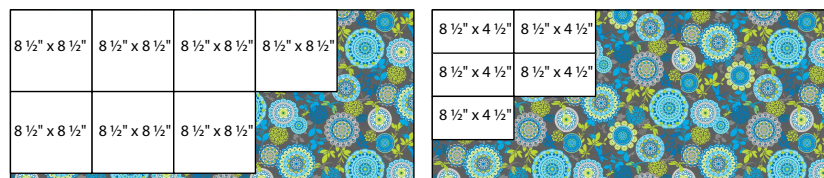
Read all instructions. Do not pre-wash fabrics. Before cutting, press fabrics with a dry iron on cotton setting; remove selvages. Use a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowance and sew fabrics with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted. Press seams in the direction of the arrows. wof = width of fabric.

## Cutting

Gray Floral Medallion:

- 7 - 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"
- 5 - 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>"

18" x 42"

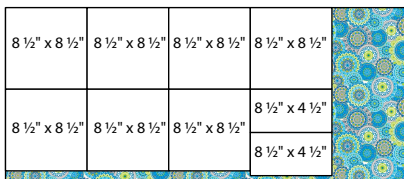


# Cutting continued...

## Half Yards 18" x 42"

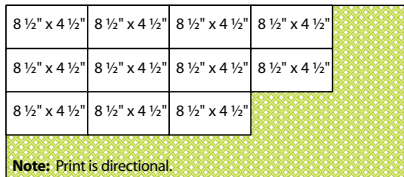
### Packed Medallions:

- 7 - 8 1/2" x 8 1/2"
- 2 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



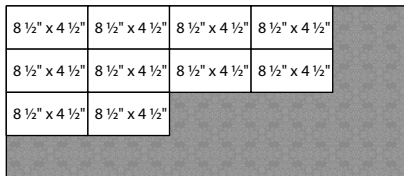
### Green Diamonds:

- 11 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



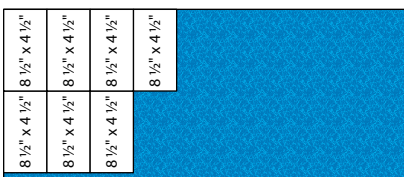
### Gray Damask:

- 10 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



### Blue Texture:

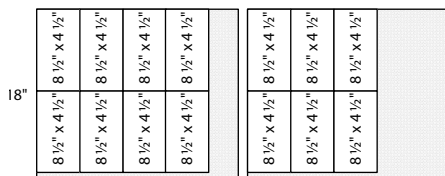
- 7 - 8 1/2" x 8 1/2"



## Fat Quarters 18" x 21"

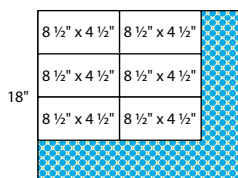
### White Lines:

- 14 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



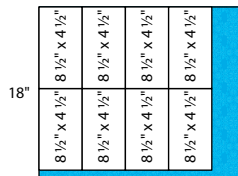
### Blue Geo:

- 6 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



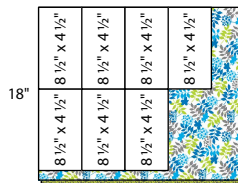
### Turq Damask:

- 8 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



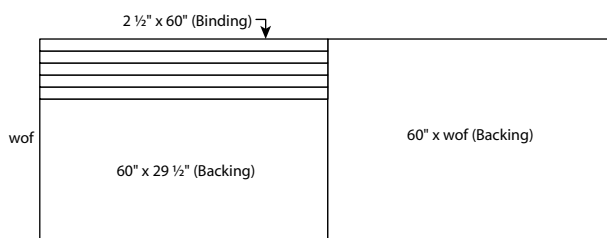
### Leaves; Green Floral

- 7 - 8 1/2" x 4 1/2"



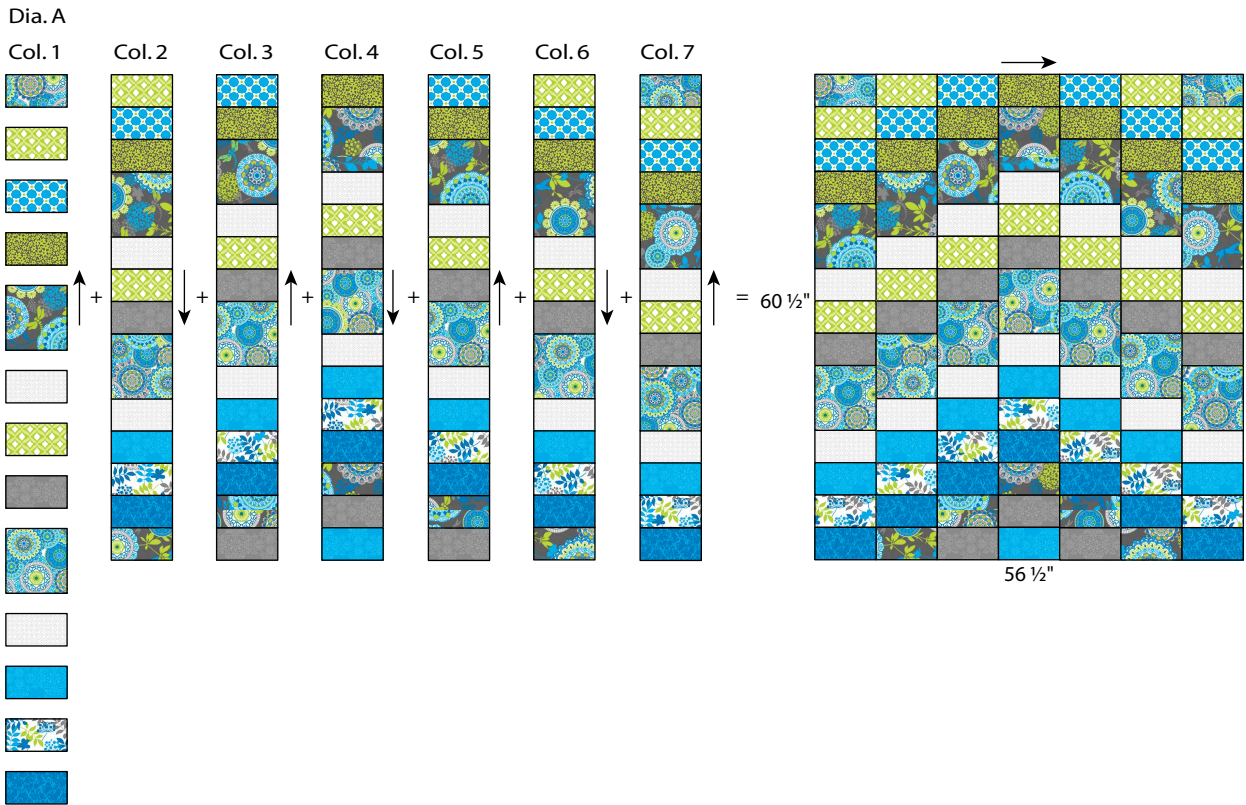
### Coordinating fabric:

- 1 - 60" x WOF (Backing)
- 1 - 60" x approx. 29 1/2" (Backing)
- 5 - 60" x 2 1/2" (Binding)

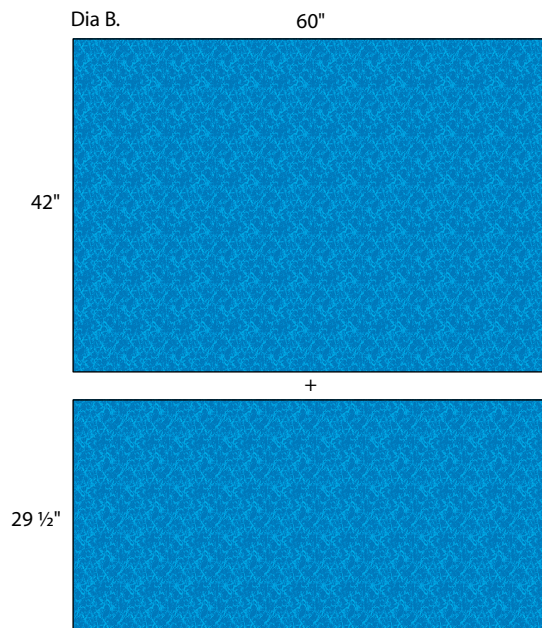


# Piecing

1. Follow Dia. A to arrange the rectangles and squares in columns.
2. Pin and sew **RST**. Press seams in even columns down, and odd columns up as indicated by the arrows. Each column should measure  $8\frac{1}{2}" \times 60\frac{1}{2}"$ . **Tip:** Pin a label with the column number at the top of each column.
3. Pin and sew the columns **RST**, matching and nesting intersecting seams. Press seams in one direction. The quilt top should measure  $56\frac{1}{2}" \times 60\frac{1}{2}"$ .



4. Make the backing referring to Dia. B, sew **RST** using  $\frac{1}{2}"$  seam allowances. Press the seams to one side.



# Quilting

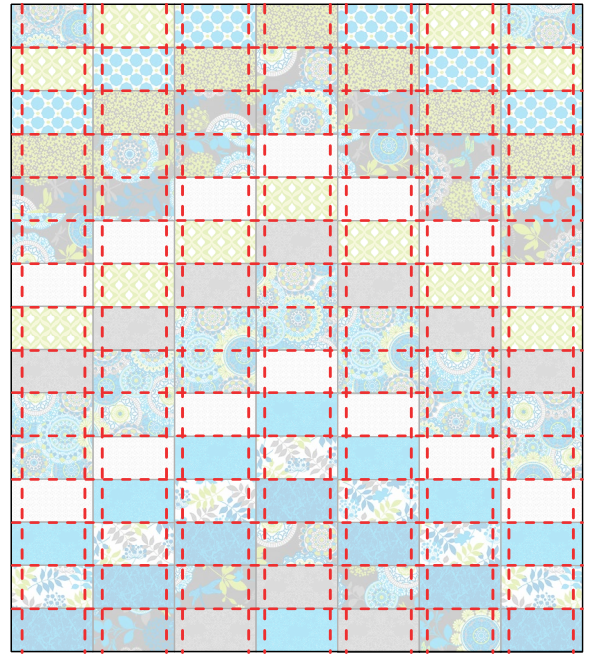
## Baste:

5. Lay backing on a flat surface **wrong** side up. Center batting, then quilt top right side up, smoothing each layer. Pin baste or spray baste the three layers together.

## Quilt:

6. Using an even-feed foot, follow vertical column seam lines and quilt  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from seams on both sides (Dia. C). Add additional lines in the ditch between rows, or quilt as desired.
7. Trim batting and backing even with quilt top; check for square corners.

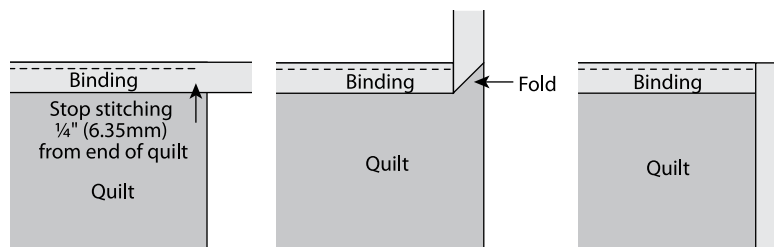

# Finishing

## Bind:

8. Sew short ends of five binding strips RST to make a continuous length; press seams open. Press one short end  $\frac{1}{4}$ " to the **wrong** side. Fold in half lengthwise with **wrong** sides together; press.
9. Leaving a 2" tail on the folded end, sew binding to front of quilt edges and fold in miters at corners. Overlap ends, trim any excess and finish sewing binding. Fold to back side of quilt to encase cut edges and sew binding in place.



# Finished Care Instructions

Wash in cold water, gentle cycle. Lay flat to dry or tumble dry on low.
