## Halloween Quilt



Finished Size: 48 " $\times 56$ " $(121.92 \mathrm{~cm} \times 142.24 \mathrm{~cm})$

## Supplies Needed

- 11 Fat Quarters (front)
- $21 / 4$ yards ( 2.06 m ) for back
- 2 Fat Quarters or $1 / 2$ yard $(45.72 \mathrm{~cm})$ for binding
- Batting: 50" x 60" (127cm x 152.4 cm )
- Coordinating thread
- Rotary cutter, mat, and acrylic ruler
- Basic sewing supplies
- Sewing machine
- Iron and pressing surface


## Before You Begin

Read all instructions before beginning project. Do not prewash fabrics. If mixing black and white, prewash gentle with Color Catcher ${ }^{\circledR}$ to catch loose dyes. Press fabrics with a dry iron before cutting. Use $1 / 4{ }^{\prime \prime}(6.35 \mathrm{~mm})$ seam allowance and sew fabrics with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted. Press seams in direction of arrows. wof $=$ width of fabric.

## Cutting

- From 11 different color Fat Quarters (front): 4-8 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 22^{\prime \prime}(21.59 \mathrm{~cm} \times 21.59 \mathrm{~cm})$ 44 total - Note: 2 will not be used
- From yardage (back): 1 of each: 60 " x wof ( $152.4 \mathrm{~cm} \times 106.68 \mathrm{~cm}$ ), 10 " x wof ( $25.4 \mathrm{~cm} \times 106.68 \mathrm{~cm}$ ), $10 " \times 20$ " ( $25.4 \mathrm{~cm} \times 50.8 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
- From 2 Fat Quarters (binding): $7-2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 21^{\prime \prime}(6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times 53.34 \mathrm{~cm})$ strips from each ( 14 total) or $1 / 2$ yard: $7-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof $(6.35 \mathrm{~cm} \times 106.68 \mathrm{~cm})$

Dia.A
Assembly

1. Number each fabric 1-11.
2. Lay out six squares in each row as shown or as desired for a total of seven rows (Dia. A).

Note: You will have two extra squares.
3. Beginning with Row 1, pin and sew squares RST; press seams in one direction as shown by arrows (Bia. B).
4. Repeat to sew Rows 2-7, pressing seams in opposite directions as shown by arrows (Dial. B).

5. Carefully match seam intersections and pin rows RST. Sew and press seams in one direction.

## Finishing

6. Sew the backing pieces together as shown (Bia. C) to make a backing approximately 60" x 51" (152.54cm x 129.54cm). Press.

7. Quilt "witch's hat" in each square as shown in Diagram D or quilt as desired. Trim batting and backing even with quilt top edges. Tip: Sewing with a walking/even-feed foot is helpful when quilting through layers. Note: Simple triangles on each square create a chevron design on reverse.
8. Sew short ends of binding strips RST in a continuous length; press seams open. Press one short end $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(6.35 \mathrm{~mm})$ to the wrong side. Press binding in half lengthwise with wrong sides together.

Option 1: Sew folded binding to the back of the quilt, mitering each corner. Fold binding to front of quilt and press. Sew close to the edge, through all layers with a serpentine or other decorative
 machine stitch.

Option 2: Sew binding to the front of the quilt, mitering each corner (Bia. E). Fold binding to the back of the quilt and handstitch in place.


## Finished Care Instructions

Machine wash cool, gentle cycle with Color Catcher ® ${ }^{\circledR}$ or dyegrabber in wash. Tumble dry low or hang to dry.
