Finished quilt size: 32½" x 32½"

Fabric Requirements

Fat quarter each of Plume-CM6590 Pacific and Plume-CM6462 Julep (A)
1/2 yard Shimmer-Ocean (includes 1/3 yard for binding) (B)
1/2 yard Dot-CM9528 Oat (C)
1/2 yard Plume-CM6461 Sage (outer border)
1 1/8 yards backing fabric of your choice
40" x 40" batting

Cutting

From both Plume-CM6590 Pacific and Plume-CM6462 Julep (A):

- Cut two 9 1/2" squares.

From Shimmer-Ocean (B):

- Cut three 2" x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut eight 2" x 5" strips and eight 2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- Cut one 1 1/2" square.
- Cut four 2 1/2" x WOF binding strips.

From Dot-CM9528 Oat (C):

- Cut three 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eight 2" x 5" strips and eight 2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- Cut six 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut four 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" sashing strips. Save the remaining four strips for the inner border.

From Plume-CM6461 Sage:

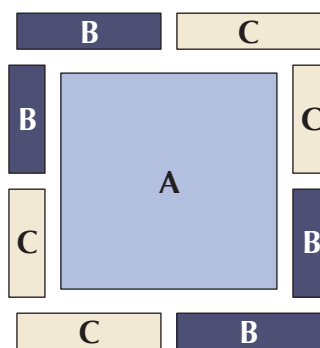
- Cut four 3" x WOF outer border strips.

Block Construction

All seam allowances are 1/4" and pieces are sewn right sides together. Note the orientation of directional prints during assembly.

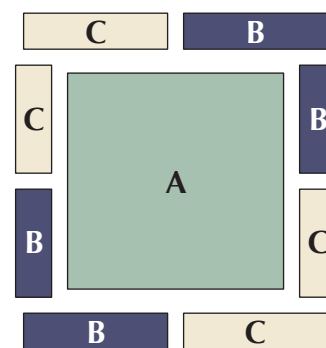
1. CM6590 Pacific will be in the upper right and lower left block centers and CM6462 Julep will be in the upper left and lower right block centers. Label the block centers by their location.
2. Sew one 2" x 5" Fabric B strip and one 2" x 5" Fabric C strip end to end to make a side unit. Make a total of eight side units.
3. Following Figure 1 and noting the fabric orientation, sew one side unit to each side of the 9 1/2" Fabric A square for the upper left block. Repeat for lower right block.
4. Sew one 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric B strip and one 2" x 6 1/2" Fabric C strip end to end to make a top/bottom unit. Make a total of eight units.
5. Referring to Figure 1 for fabric placement, sew the top/bottom units to the blocks. Each block should measure 12 1/2" square.
6. Following Figure 2, repeat steps 1-5 to make the upper right block and the lower left block.

Topper Assembly

7. Referring to the table topper photo for block placement and orientation, lay out the blocks in two rows of two blocks each.
8. Sew a 1½" x 12½" Fabric C sashing strip to the right side of the upper left block. Sew the upper right block to the sashing strip. Repeat to sew the 1½" x 12½" Fabric C sashing strip to the second row.
9. Sew a 1½" x 12½" Fabric C sashing strip to the 1½" Fabric B square. Sew a 1½" x 12½" Fabric C sashing strip to other side of the 1½" Fabric B square. Sew this sashing unit between rows 1 and 2, aligning adjacent seams.
10. Measure the topper center length and cut two strips that measurement from the 1½" x WOF Fabric C strips. Sew one strip to each side of the topper.
11. Measure the topper center width and cut two 1½" Fabric C strips that measurement. Sew one strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the table topper.
12. Repeat steps 10-11 for the outer border.

Finishing

13. Layer the table topper, batting and backing, and quilt as desired.
14. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the topper front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
15. Fold the binding to the topper underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the back.
