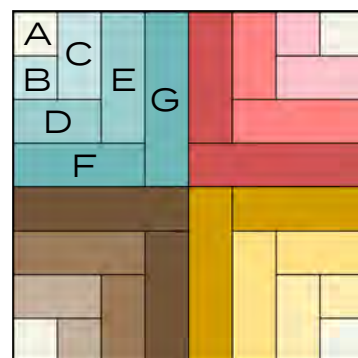
## FRACTURED RAINBOW

### CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

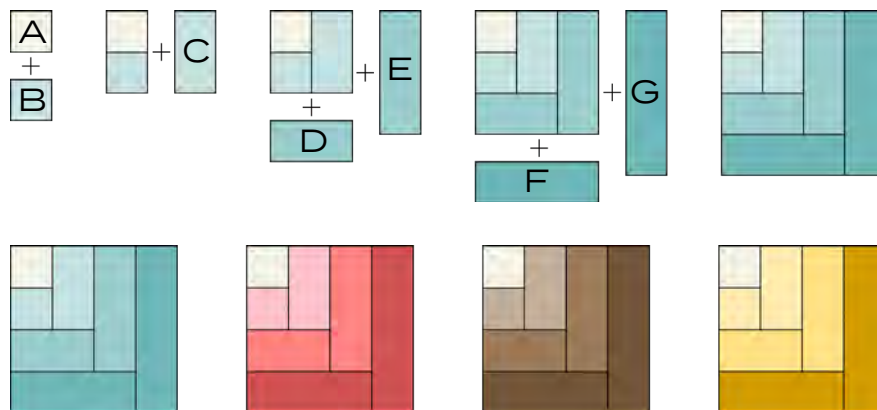
(Please note: Diagrams show the block using (4) unique colorways, each quadrant featuring a selection of fabrics from one color family. Cut units A-G according to the quantity of colorways you wish to create.)



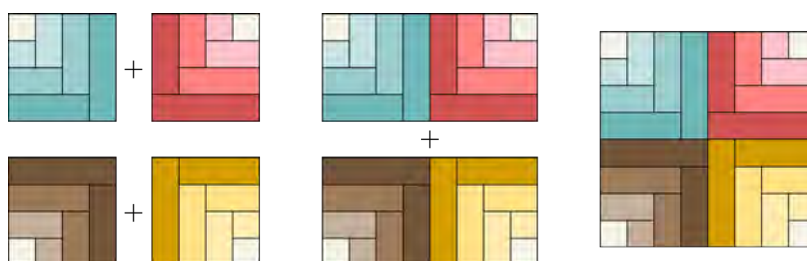
	4" Block	6" Block	8" Block	12" Block
A:	(4) 1" squares.	(4) 1 ¼" squares.	(4) 1 ½" squares.	(4) 2" squares.
B:	(4) 1" squares.	(4) 1 ¼" squares.	(4) 1 ½" squares.	(4) 2" squares.
C:	(4) 1" x 1 ½" rectangles	(4) 1 ¼" x 2" rectangles.	(4) 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles.	(4) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles.
D:	(4) 1" x 1 ½" rectangles.	(4) 1 ¼" x 2" rectangles.	(4) 1 ½" x 2 ½" rectangles.	(4) 2" x 3 ½" rectangles.
E:	(4) 1" x 2" rectangles.	(4) 1 ¼" x 2 ¾" rectangles.	(4) 1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles.	(4) 2" x 5" rectangles.
F:	(4) 1" x 2" rectangles	(4) 1 ¼" x 2 ¾" rectangles.	(4) 1 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles.	(4) 2" x 5" rectangles.
G:	(4) 1" x 2 ½" rectangles.	(4) 1 ¼" x 3 ½" rectangles.	(4) 1 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles.	(4) 2" x 6 ½" rectangles.

# ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:

- Each quadrant is sewn using log cabin piecing techniques. Cut units B-G are sewn onto the A square in alphabetical order and in layers as shown. Begin by attaching the B square onto the A square using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Finish by attaching the G rectangle. Diagrams show the quadrant in all stages of assembly. Press toward the last sewn square/rectangle.
- Repeat to create (4) quadrants using the same piecing methods. Quadrants will be identical in composition but may vary in color.
- Use the following guide for quadrant measurements:
  - 4" Block:  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $2$ " x  $2$ " finished)
  - 6" Block:  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $3$ " x  $3$ " finished)
  - 8" Block:  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $4$ " x  $4$ " finished)
  - 12" Block:  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $6$ " x  $6$ " finished)



- Arrange all (4) quadrants as shown, turning the quadrants so that A squares will create the corners of the block. Arrows indicate pressing instructions.
- Sew together as shown to complete the block.



- Trim block using the guide listed below:
  - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $4$ " x  $4$ " finished)
  - $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $6$ " x  $6$ " finished)
  - $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $8$ " x  $8$ " finished)
  - $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished ( $12$ " x  $12$ " finished)
