

CIRCLING AROUND

These pieced circles are perfect for this modern quilt. Choose some amazing color combinations or use your fabulous stash. A lot of fun to make these curves easy and perfect every time when you know the right techniques. Big blocks and quick construction make this a fun project for skill and creativity. And.... this pattern has 4 quilt sizes to choose from.

FABRIC

Background Fabric

As you can see on the pattern cover the quilt has 4 background fabrics in black and white dots. My quilt hanging in the store also has several background prints. You choose whatever you like. It can be a variation of background colors or just one color. Use your imagination and have fun.

Follow the pattern for fabric requirements for the size you wish to make.

Rings

For each block you will need to cut 16 rings.

I suggest using yardage, fat quarters, ¼ yard or scraps for the rings. They can be scrappy or you can have a plan. Have fun with your imagination.

Circle Center

Each circle center piece requires about a 7" square. The block is constructed in 4 sections so you will need 4- 7" squares for each block.

On the pattern picture and my quilt in the store 4 background fabrics were used for three blocks. The rings and the center blocks were also done with three blocks in the same or similar colors. You will need to do a little planning before you begin to determine how

you want to design the colors and fabrics in your quilt. How many fat quarters, yardage or scraps you will need. Call or text if you have questions. Here to help.

Cut out your quilt before class if you can – or a portion of it if you can.

It gives you a jump on getting started. And if you can't cut out before class no worries I can help you in class.

SUPPLIES

- Thread to match your fabrics or a nice neutral thread such as a light gray or beige.
- Sharp Fabric scissors
- Pins
- Small Iron and Ironing Mat (Optional- but handy)
- Sewing Machine
- Foot Pedal
- Sewing machine manual (if you think you might need it or have a new or unfamiliar machine).
- Any other supplies you might need or like to use.
