

## Quiltworx Haystack Cookies

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Skill Level: Advanced Beginner

Learn to make a 12" x 36" pieced table runner using a Quiltworx Haystack Cookies pattern. This class is a wonderful advanced beginner project that comes together quickly. It is a great project for those just beginning to learn the Judy Neimeyer method of paper piecing, or an experienced quilter looking for an easy stash buster. This scrappy and adorable quilt would make a great wall hanging, or table runner. A great way to use up that stash of 10 inch squares and 2 1/2 inch strips!

In this class we will focus on creating the blocks needed using many of the techniques found in Quiltworx patterns. Techniques include: preparing papers, foundation paper piecing, stacking and organization, straight piecing, and four-point spun seams for flat quilt block intersections. Replacement papers for this pattern are also available if you wish to make additional blocks or a larger quilt size.
