

Heading South Supplies

Perfect your Flying Geese technique with this great project. The pattern is for a throw (64" x 68") but I made mine smaller; you can enlarge or condense the design to fit your needs. The pattern describes using the 'no waste' method of creating flying geese and I will discuss several other methods of achieving great flying geese. A terrific way to use your 'stash' or have an excuse to try out the latest fabric line.

REQUIRED PATTERN:

Heading South by Amanda Castor for Material Girl Quilts

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS: (I made my sample smaller than the pattern.)

1/2 Yard **EACH** of about 5 different fabric colors (pattern used orange, yellow, green, blue, and gray). You can make this very scrappy if you wish by having various fabrics in each color (should have about 1/2 yard total of each main color).

3-1/2 Yards for Background

1/2 Yard for Binding

4 Yards for Backing

NOTE: If you are planning to have your project quilted by a long-arm Quilter you may want to get 1-1/4 yards for security purposes.

GENERAL SUPPLIES:

Rotary Cutter and Your Favorite Ruler

Regular Sewing Thread in Neutral Shade to Blend with Fabric (I like Aurifil)

New Needles (80/12 Sharp are my favorites)

Hera Marker, Wooden Iron, Bone Folder, Point Turner (optional but very helpful)

Straight Pins (I like the Clover Patchwork Pins)

Seam Ripper (I like the Clover one)

1/4" Foot **OR** the foot you use to get a 1/4" wide seam allowance

Sewing Machine in Good Working Order

Sewing Machine Bobbins, Power Cord, Foot Pedal, and Manual
