REQUIRED BOOK:

A Merry Christmas with Kim Schaefer for C&T Publishing

REQUIRED FABRIC:

1/2 Yard Gray for Appliqué Background

1/8 Yard Red for Inner Border

1/2 Yard Total Assorted Brights for Pieced Border

1/2 Yard Light for Snowman

1/4 Yard Black for Neck, Arms, Buttons, Eyes, Legs, and Cardinal Faces

1/4 Yard Black Print for Boots

Scrap of Orange for Nose

Scraps of Two Different Reds for Cardinal Bodies and Wings

Scrap of Yellow for Cardinal Beaks

1 Yard Paper-Backed Fusible Web (I really like SoftFuse)

3/4 to 1 Yard for Backing (depending if you are quilting it yourself or not)

1/4 Yard Binding

Batting for Quilting

GENERAL SUPPLIES:

Rotary Cutter and Ruler

Thread for Stitching (I like Aurifil in a neutral color)

Decorative Thread for Stitching Appliqué Down

Scissors (will be cutting paper and fabric both)

Appliqué Pressing Sheet (my favorite is a Teflon one)

Straight Pins (I like the Clover Patchwork ones)

Seam Ripper (I like the Clover one)

Seams are 1/4" so you'll want the foot you use to stitch this accurately

If you are doing machine stitching around the appliqué designs you may find an Open Toe Foot to be very helpful.

Walking Foot for Quilting and Attaching Binding

Sewing Machine in Good Working Order Sewing Machine Bobbins, Regular Sewing Foot, Power Cord, Foot Pedal, Manual

PREP WORK:

If you wish you may want to trace the designs for fusing onto the **PAPER** side of your fusible web prior to class. Also, you may wish to piece the background prior to class so you can jump right into the appliqué work.
