## Discover Canada Map

### Fabric Requirements:

Discover Canada Map 1 panel

Discover Canada City Blocks 14 blocks

Canadian Cities fabric .3 metre

Kona Gold fabric .3 metre

Red and Black Discover Canada Maple Leaf fabric 1.25 metres

### Cutting and Piecing Instructions;

1. From the Discover Canada Map fabric, cut the map to 32 1/2" w x 22 1/2" h centering the map as best as possible.
2. From the Discover Canada Canadian City blocks, choose 14 blocks. If you choose cities that are next to each other you don't have to cut them up individually. Keep as many as you can together if possible.
3. From the 14 cities choose 5 for the top and 5 for the bottom. Assemble 5 together at each side. The total width of this row must be 52 1/2" wide and 11 1/2" high. You may have to add black strips of fabric to make up the difference in order to achieve the 52 1/2" wide.
4. From the remaining 4 Discover Canada city blocks, sew together two blocks at the top and bottom making sure the finished size is 22 1/2" high and 10 1/2" wide. Again, you may have to add black fabric between them to adjust the size to fit.
5. Sew these two rectangles to each side of the map and press.
6. From the Discover Canada City Name fabric, cut 3 strips Width of Fabric WOF 3 1/2" wide.
7. Sew these together at the short end. Trim to make two strips 52 1/2" wide.
8. Sew the two city name strips to the top and bottom of the map section and press.
9. From the Kona Gold fabric cut 3 strips 3 1/2" WOF
10. Sew these together at the short end. Trim to make two strips 52 1/2" wide.
11. Sew the Kona Gold fabric to the top of one of 5 City row blocks and one Kona Gold fabric to the bottom of the other city row blocks.
12. Sew the City Block sections to the top and bottom of the centre of the quilt and press.
13. Add the borders. From the Discover Canada maple leaf fabric cut 7 strips 6 1/2" wide WOF. For the top and bottom border, sew together at the short end, two strips and trim to make a border 52 1/2" long. Repeat to make a second border.
14. Sew together the remaining maple leaf strips to make two borders for the sides measuring 68" long.
15. Sew these long borders to each side of the quilt and press.
