Block Size: 12" Quilt Size: $42^{\prime \prime} \times 42^{\prime \prime}$

## Materials for 9 Block Quilt Above:

- 1-1/4 yard light background fabric
- 1/2 yard print for umbrella "teardrop" shape and handles
- Assorted 3" x wof strips for foundation pieced arcs
-- Total of 72 rectangles (cut 2-1/2" x 3") are needed for the 9 parasols/umbrellas
-- These can be assorted scraps or coordinated colors
-- Each 3" strip will yield sixteen 2-1/2" x 3 " rectangles
-- Each parasol requires 8 rectangles
-- 9 squares $3 " \times 3$ " for prairie point umbrella tips (asstd. prints)
- Border fabrics can be:
-- Cut from coordinating fat quarters or variety of scraps
-- 3-1/2" strips (8 cut 3-1/2" x 12-1/2" and 4 cut $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} x$
15-1/2")
- Advise waiting until quilt center is finished
-- Cut from a SINGLE border print (1/2-5/8 yard is sufficient)
-- Binding (1/3 yard)
-- NON-fusible interfacing, cut into 9 strips 6" x 13"
-- FUSIBLE webbing (Wonder Under, Heat ' n Bond, etc) 1/3 yard (for handles)
-- Thread for invisible appliqué of parasol to background square

This variation on the traditional Double Wedding Ring makes for a delightful summer quilt.

While this is not for beginners, it is certainly enjoyable - and doable - for those who are confident with their piecing skills.

Students will learn:

- Easy foundation piecing of the parasol arcs
- Gentle curved piecing of the arc to the
teardrop shape (gray floral in my blocks)
- Turning the curved edges under using non-fusible interfacing
- Raw edge appliqué of the handle
- Making a prairie point parasol tip for a 3-D effect

Pattern fee of $\$ 12.00$ will include all paper templates, multi-page well illustrated instructions, master pattern for foundations and 9 newsprint foundations for project.
