Second-generation Japanese American, Susan has been sewing since age 14. She knew that sewing in the traditional Japanese style was the path she wanted to follow for her quilting inspiration. When her own work inspired her to teach, she began with basic quilting classes in sashiko, shibori dyeing, and then branched out to Japanese free-form design classes.

Join us on Monday, May 15, 2023 at 10AM for a trunk show/lecture where Susan will discuss how quilters can incorporate Japanese Shibori, Katazome and Sashiko techniques into their quilts. Susan will bring examples to show the difference between the techniques and her collection of Japanese fabrics.

Lecture attendance is free for LIQS members. Workshop participants should bring their lunch.



Take a deep dive into one group of colors, raid your stash and scraps. Choose your color, vary the tints, shades, tones, values. Stick with it. You can choose any color, including neutrals. At least 90% of the quilt top must be the main focus color, the rest can be accent color(s) of your choice. Required size is approximately 48" x 54". Be prepared to reveal your quilt for Show & Tell at the June dinner.
