We are a small group of ladies who get together weekly to sew quilts for charity. Last year's total was 102 quilts, 60X80, over 7 yards each, all from donated fabric. Not every quilter is a member of our congregation. Margot Cohen was very active and dedicated for over 10 years. We bless the quilts annually and then forward them to Lutheran World Relief, in New Windsor, MD. In 2020 they sent about 350,000 quilts around the world to people living in extreme poverty in Africa, Asia, Central America, Peru, and other places. This year the emphasis is the refugees from Ukraine living in Poland.
