Class: English Paper Piecing (EPP) Instructor: Elen Levenberg

We will be hand sewing a small coaster/mug rug from hexagon shapes. Sample packs are provided by Paper Pieces (PaperPieces.com) Additional supplies needed: Needle, thread, thimble, seam ripper (to rip out basting stitches), scissors, clips. Warning:

EPP may become very addicting.



Class: Dish Mat Bag

Two dish mats convert to a tote bag. Supplies: Two dish mats (\$8-12), one yard webbing or sturdy ribbon, fabric scrap for snap closure (about 2" to 5" finished), magnetic snap closure or other closure button, firm interfacing or hard cardboard for the base.



Class: Dance Floor

A bold, modern quilt featuring colorful diamond blocks that create movement and eye-catching secondary patterns. A fun, approachable project with big visual impact. Perfect for showing off color and fabric choices.



Class: Migrating Geese

This project uses a Studio 180 Design pattern to create four tall columns of Flying Geese blocks that look like they're "migrating" across the quilt. It's a fun way to practice precision piecing and see how a simple block can turn into a really striking design.



Class: Log Cabin Quilt Block

This project is a fun take on the classic log cabin block and is part of a beautiful block-of-the-month program. Each block builds around a simple center motif, making it a great way to practice strip piecing and play with layout. A relaxed, satisfying project that comes together into a really charming quilt.



Class: Strip-Pieced Quilt

An strip-pieced quilt that comes together quickly while creating a stunning secondary pinwheel design. The repeating blocks add movement and visual interest, making this project both fun to make and impressive to display. This is a great opportunity to use some of your stash too!
