smaller quilts, and your quilt must have your name on it.



Thoughts

What Kind of Quilter Are You? Emily Mann

Would you place yourself into any particular style category? Do you follow a pattern? Do you refer to a pattern and edit it at will? Do you design your own pattern? Do you not use any pattern? Do you quilt from a kit? Are you improvisational? How adept are you at changing a mistake into an aesthetic element?

Every quilter begins with a journey. Mine started with a friend and a book. This friend, a longtime LIQS member, you know who are (!) ... Twenty years ago she told me I could quilt before I knew it. I resisted with all sorts of excuses, but eventually caved. The book, *Quilting for the First Time*, inspired my first project, a sampler that introduced nine of the most basic traditional blocks. It's composed of bargain remnants, woefully uneven, the stitches are erratic, the knots aren't all buried, but it speaks volumes. That simple start gave way to experimentation with shapes, color combinations, and lots of mistakes. The learning process had begun, followed by trial and error, more traditional blocks. More-more-more. Patterns. Fabrics. Tools. Repurposed storage space. Stylistic binges. Accuquilt (a separate addiction)! Traditional segued into breaking a few rules. That's what makes it fun. It evolves.

What kind of quilter? If we must categorize, I guess it ends up as traditional-quasi-modern. Maybe the next project will change all that.

The Long Island Quilters' Society, Inc. is a non-profit organization dedicated to furthering an interest in quilting, encouraging the preservation of our quilt heritage, and offering year-round instructional opportunities for its members. The society provides a meeting where quilters can support each other's growth and development. The membership year is from September 1 through August 31; annual membership fee is \$40. Members receive a bi-monthly newsletter and are eligible to participate in workshops. Monthly meetings are held at the Freeport Recreation Center, 130 E. Merrick Road, Freeport, NY.
