**3. NEW BUSINESS**

Chad gave an update on the problems with the well. They can't get a camera down in the 3 inch hole in the humbug well. There is no water coming from the humbug well. The cottonwood spring is keeping up. The tanks are staying full with the water coming from the spring. The company that drills in the well is coming up on May 22, 2018. The Division of water quality is putting pressure on the former engineering company for answers on the work they performed on the well. Hopefully Chad will have some answers tomorrow. Aqua and Chad have notified the State.

Webster Construction is removing the trees around the spring. Bruce Manning wants to make sure they aren't removing too many trees. They don't want to get too close to the springs box because they are worried about getting mud in the spring or damaging the box. They don't want to get any mud in the spring. The cottonwood spring water is basically free; there is no power charge and no pumping fee.

Councilor Frazier asked if the Humbug was the only tank that didn't have a cover on it. Chad stated they will have to drain the 1,000 gallon tank to clean it out. Maple Ridge is another problem, there aren't enough fire hydrants.

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A. Tentative 2018-2019 budget presented to the City Council to review, adopt and set a date for the public hearing

Tami gave the Council a copy of the budget and asked them to review the 2018 budget. She asked them to also look at the 2019 budget so we had a better idea of what exactly we were going to be spending money on. She stated that a budget could always be amended but really just in cases of an emergency. The Council then set a date for the public hearing

***Councilor Wilmoth made a motion to adopt the tentative budget for 2018- 2019 and the date for the public hearing is June 11, 2018. Councilor Hoggan seconded the motion, all voted in favor***

B. Jewel Markham – Discussion on building rental

Jewel stated they wanted to start a chapter of Adult children of alcoholics. She gave the Council a run-down of what the group was about. They wanted to use the cattlemen’s hall once a week on Tuesdays at 5:30.

The Council said they could use the building once a week and pay the same price as A A.


C. Riley Rockhill – Discussion on a soda shack during the Celebration


Riley didn’t come to the meeting
