1. Call to Order and Roll Call

2. Preliminary Items

- A. Welcome & Introductions: Mayor Wade Woolstenhulme

- C. Approval of Minutes
April 4, 2016

Councilor Frazier made a motion to approve the minutes of April 4, 2016. Councilor Rydalch seconded the motion, all voted in favor

- D. Report and Approval of Bills to be paid

Councilor Woolstenhulme made a motion to pay the bills as noted on the register. Councilor Frazier seconded the motion, all voted in favor.

3. New Business

- A. Tentative 2016 – 2017 budget presented to the City Council to review, adopt and set a date for public hearing

Tami handed out the tentative budget for 2016-2017 year. She explained to the Council what was set forth in the budget. The largest budget item would be \$100,000.00 for the final two membranes for the sewer plant.

The Council asked questions concerning the budget. After a brief discussion Mayor Woolstenhulme asked the Council for a motion.

Councilor Hoggan made a motion to adopt the tentative budget for the 2016-2017 year and to set the date of June 6, 2016 to receive public comment on the tentative budget. Councilor Rydalch seconded the motion, all voted in favor

B. Michael Peterson – Rocky Mountain Power

Michael was at the Council meeting to review the energy audit that had taken place in 5 locations the City pays bills on. He explained the process from finding a vendor to completing the process.

C. Les England – South Summit Trails

Les wanted to introduce what the South Summit Trails was about. They are a non-profit organization with a 5 member board they began the organization about 6 months ago. Their goal is to establish an equestrian, hiking and mountain biking trail from Peoa to Woodland. Currently the group is working on pump track in at the Marion Park. They are also working with the property owners next to the Franson Estates to maybe expand the existing trail. They are also interested in Rocky Point to expand that trail. They would also like to expand the Oakley trail.

D. Set Maple Ridge Water Fee

Mayor Woolstenhulme asked if the letters had been mailed out to the Maple Ridge residents. Tami stated that the letters had been mail and had only one inquiry about the charge. There was no further discussion about the water fee for Maple Ridge

Councilor Rydalch made a motion to create a special water zone that is subject to a high elevation surcharge of 2.50 per thousand gallons used. Councilor Hoggan seconded the motion, all voted in favor

E. Sam Aplanalp – Rodeo Committee

Sam and the Council reviewed the itinerary for the celebration. They went over each item on the poster. Saturday night will be tough enough to wear pink and there will be the dance. This will be put in the program as well.

There was discussion on the sign for the sponsors and how they will be placed in the arena

4. Old Business

A. Red Barn Update

Tiny discussed the progress with the landscaping and the bride rooms at the red barn.

B. Celebration Review

There was a discussion on the fees for the breakfast and the BBQ. The Council decided to keep the breakfast fees would stay the same as last year, the BBQ would be increased to \$8.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children. The City staff will pick up all the paper products for the cowboy breakfast, City breakfast and BBQ.
