**3. Public Hearing**

A. City Council to adopt the final budget for the 2017- 2018 fiscal year and possible resolution No. 2017-02

The Council reviewed the final budget for the 2017-2018 fiscal year. The Council added a field for Fire Prevention and made a motion to accept the budget with that amended.

***Councilor Smart made a motion to adopt the budget for 2017 – 2018 as amended and sign resolution 2017-02. Councilor Wilmoth seconded the motion, all voted in favor***

B. City Council to amend budget for the 2016-2017 fiscal year

The Council reviewed the charges made to the 2016-2017 and a motion was made.

#### 4. New Business

##### A. Braxton Booth – Eagle Scout Project

Braxton introduced himself to the Council and stated that he would like to improve the trail at the end of Fransen Estates. He needs gravel, weed killer and he would do the work. He handed out some pictures of the project.

Mayor Woolstenhulme indicated he would like to talk to the person who was leasing the property to make sure it wouldn't interfere with his lease. The Council asked questions regarding the cost of the project.

The Mayor and City Council thought it would be a good project. Mayor Woolstenhulme asked Braxton to check back at the City Office in a couple of weeks.

##### B. Ken Patey – Discussion on the Oakley School Property

Ken said that he was a neighbor to the Oakley School property as well as Sheri Kay and Kent Leavitt. Whenever a school like this closes it is a concern to adjacent property owners in regard to what will happen with the property. He has meet with the owners of the school property; he talked about why the school closed and what the options are in regards to the future. He brought with him Lance Allred who was a pro basketball player with the Claviers and Arron Newman who is a Council member with Snyderville Basin and the director of mental health for Summit County. He didn't come here to say what it should be, he and some investors would be interested in leasing the property if the City would entertain some of the options he was suggesting.

Arron discussed the need for a mental health facility in Summit County. This property has everything the County would need in regards to beds and a close place to bring residents in crises.

Lance has started a non-profit organization to help youths with problems. The organization is called Courage and Grit. He has been looking for about a year to find a facility that he could have basketball camps and teach the youth about leadership and mentoring. This facility is exactly what he has been looking for. There would still be a tax base for the City but his focus is on helping troubled youth.

Ken stated that he didn't want to do anything to change Oakley; he just wants to see the facility put to a use that would enhance Oakley. He isn't asking the Council to make a decision tonight he would just like to know that they would entertain some of these ideas.

The Council discussed various options and they want something positive to come out of using the facility. They don't want to see it stay vacant.
