Councilor Hoggan made a motion to pay the bills as noted on the register. Councilor Frazier seconded the motion, all voted in favor.

3. New Business

- A. Bryce Boyer – Summit District Fire Warden

Bryce explained the hand out along with the agreement he wanted the Council to sign. The agreement would cover the costs of a fire. If the City opted not to sign the agreement the City would be responsible for the cost (See Attachment # A).

There was discussion about the agreement and what the City need to do to achieve their end of the agreement.

Bryce asked the Council to sign the cooperative agreement between the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands.

Councilor Frazier made a motion to sign the agreement. Councilor Smart seconded the motion, all voted in favor

- B. Web site/direct payment for water and sewer payments

Councilor Smart showed the Council the new website layout. You can now buy tickets right on your phone and then the tickets can be scanned from your phone. The monthly schedule will be available to see on line. There will also be a way to pay from the website if the City has Express Bill Pay.

Express Bill Pay has reviewed our account and they think that Zions is giving us a better deal. They would come and set up our system. They have a deal on Government on utility payments. (See attachment #B).

Smart made a motion to contract with Express Bill pay and putting our water payments on line. Councilor Hoggan seconded the motion, all voted in favor

C. Art work Cattlemen's Hall

Councilor Smart stated that now that the Cattlemen's hall is being remodeled, he thinks it would be nice to put some Don Weller art work in the hall. We have some prints and could hire Blake to frame them. The Council decided to wait and see how much money would be left from the grant the City received.

D. Advertising of the Red Barn

Councilor Smart said that Utahdrives.com for about \$900.00 they will put you on their online even calendar. They also have a book. He felt that we would only have to do it for one year. We will table this topic until a later date.

E. Hiring an artist to make a logo for the red Barn

Councilor Smart handed out a picture of a logo stating that we could use this for marketing. Janet would do 3 drafts and a final draft for \$500.00. The Council will discuss this later.

F. Discussion on Public Hearing for trails

Mayor Woolstenhulme sated it was time to get input from the public to see how the community felt about trails and the Stevens Park. He recommended having a joint meeting with the planning commission on February 27, 2017, at 6:30 in the cattlemen's hall.

G. Job description for Public Works position

Mayor Woolstenhulme met with Kelly Kimber to help with all the state laws and create a job description to cover all the areas the City needed help with. He read over the description with the Council.


