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45 A. Chad Ambrose – Rocky Mountain Power
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47 Chad Ambrose came to the Council meeting to introduce himself to the Council members that
48 were newly elected or members he hadn't met yet. He stated that Rocky Mountain Power had been a
49 sponsor of the Oakley Rodeo since he came to Park City in 2008. He asked if they had any questions or
50 concerns.

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53 B. Dallas Thacker – concerns about the bidding process and the sewer plant

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55 Dallas stated he had been in the office looking over the documents pertaining to the construction
56 of the Red Barn. He could only find bids for the heating and air conditioning. Mayor Woolstenhulme
57 explained that the Red Barn was constructed under the Municipal Building Authority. He read the Utah
58 code, 17D-2-108 (see attachment #A) stating they don't need to get bids if it's build under the Municipal
59 Building Authority.

60 Dallas asked why the City hired an engineering service to take care of the plant when you have
61 people right here that can take care of it. There is supposed to be a budget put together and money
62 added to service the plant. Mayor Woolstenhulme informed Dallas that the City had spent around
63 \$600,000.00 over the last few years in maintenance at the sewer plant.

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67 The Mayor wanted to discuss salaries for City Employees and work on this at the work meeting on March

71 Mayor Woolstenhulme said he had met with people from the County health department. They
72 would like to make sure the City is requiring perk tests be completed before a building permit is being
73 issued.

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75 E. Sponsorship possibility

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77 Mayor Woolstenhulme turned the time over to Rustin Young to explain the sponsorship
78 possibility to the Council. RFD TV would like Oakley Rodeo to sponsor a program called Special Cowboy
79 Moments. The sponsorship would cost \$5,700.00. Rustin said he was sure the Rodeo Committee could
80 find a sponsor to cover the cost but they need to sign the contract now and pay the sponsorship fee as
81 soon as possible.
