3. New Business

A. Logan Woolstenhulme – possible basketball court

Logan told the Council that he loves to play basketball and there is no public basketball court. He would like the Council to find a place in the City where a basketball court could be built. The Council thought it was a good idea and asked Logan to research some costs to build the court. Councilor Smart thought there was a possibility this could be added to the grant he was working on.

Councilor Smart said he has been working on a State recreation grant. The individual he has been working with loves what Oakley is doing. He indicated that if the City partners with other entities we could qualify for about \$150,000.00. Councilor Smart said he has been working with South Summit Trails as a co-applicant. The trails foundation would receive the \$50,000.00 and the City would receive \$100,000.00. The grant would require a 50/50 match. The City is applying for the grant to create a campground with trails at the Oakley Recreation Complex.

Councilor Edmunds made a motion to approve going forward with the grant. Steve seconded the motion, all voted in favor

C. Oakley City camping area in the river bottoms

Councilor Smart contacted Stacy Santos to draw some plans for the campground. He shared the drawings with the Council and there was a discussion on camp sites and what to include at each site.

D. Review of the visit from the State on the water system

All the Council received an email from the State. Mayor Woolstenhulme turned the time over to Chad. Chad discussed the deficiencies and recommendations from the State (see attachment #A). The Council needs to prioritize the recommendations and budget the repairs in the next budget year.

Councilor Frazier informed the Council that he had also been working on a transportation grant to repair roads in the City. He has some estimates for 4 different sections of roads that need to be repaired. The grant is a 50/50 match, there is approximately \$193,870.00 remaining in the Class C road money. He is suggesting that we work on section 1 and section 2 of the proposal for a total of \$85,100.00 (see attachment #B). The Council suggested that he request \$100,000.00 and we would have plenty of matching money to include 1 more section.

Councilor Hoggan made a motion to go into closed session. Councilor Edmunds seconded the motion, all voted in favor
