**3. NEW BUSINESS**

A. Discuss the appointment of a new Council Member

The Council decided to post the opening in the Summit News and have all application due on October 5, 2018. Applicants will be interviewed at the regular meeting on October 8, 2018.

B. Community Dinner

Mayor Woolstenhulme reminded everyone of the community dinner on September 17, 2018. The dinner will start at 6 pm. All Council members need to be to the Red Barn at 5 pm.

C. Progress on the Outdoor recreation grant and trails

47 Councilor Smart indicated that the owner of the land along the City property and New Lane is  
48 willing to do a land swap that would create a 20 ft corridor to create a trail on New Lane. He has worked  
49 with Weller Recreation to donate 4 more loads of roto mill to put on the north side of the arena. Chris  
50 Dillman will bring a roller to compact the roto mill. South Summit Trails have paid everything except  
51 7,000.00. They would like the City to give them \$17,000.00 to cover costs and will reimburse the City  
52 when we make a draw from the Outdoor Recreation grant.

53 Councilor Frazier asked what would happen if there isn't enough money to finish the camp ground.  
54 Mayor Woolstenhulme said we have until December 2019 to use the money from the grant.

60 **4. OLD BUSINESS**

62 Dallas Hansen gave an update on buildings and grounds. He indicated there might be a need for a  
63 new stove in the Town Hall. The plumber is coming to work on the plumbing at the Town Hall. The  
64 Fridge in the Red Barn was leaking Freon, which has been repaired. He will begin fertilizing using the  
65 weed and feed the City already has. He has been adjusting sprinkler heads and trying to keep up on the  
66 mowing.

67 Councilor Wilmoth asked if anything had been done about the weeds in the retention pond, the grass  
68 behind the arena, and the grass growing up in the chain link around the ball diamonds. Dallas stated he  
69 has been trying to use up the old weed killer. There was a discussion on what fertilizer would be best to  
70 use.

71 Councilor Hoggan thanked Dallas for everything he did for the car show.

72 Mayor Woolstenhulme asked if they were scoping and cleaning the sewer lines. Dallas said Chad had  
73 set that up before he went on vacation. They will also be installing the new Neptune meters this week.

74 Councilor Smart in kind donation to redo the floor in the red barn. A woman said there were no  
75 horses allowed on the trail. Mayor Woolstenhulme stated they didn't want a place where people  
76 couldn't ride their horses. We wouldn't want them on the fields. Mayor Woolstenhulme asked Dallas to  
77 write up a list of what the signs should say and the Council would review them. Councilor Smart said  
78 South Summit Trails has access for signage. They will also look into getting doggy bags for people to  
79 clean up after their dogs.
