Cutting Instructions include the 1/4" seam allowance for sewing.**

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS *LOF = Length of Fabric; WOF = Width of Fabric*

**Center Piece** — 30-1/2" wide x 40-1/2" high

### Border A

(4) 8-1/2" x LOF strips—then cut into:

- (1) 8-1/2" x 41-1/2" (Section 1)
- (1) 8-1/2" x 39-1/2" (Section 1)
- (3) 8-1/2" x 8-1/2" (Section 2/Unit 2B;  
Section 4/Unit 4A, Unit 4D)
- (1) 8-1/2" x 30-1/2" (Section 2/Unit 2C)
- (1) 8-1/2" x 40-1/2" (Section 4/Unit 4B)

### Border B

(3) 6-1/2" x WOF strips

Sew (2) strips together on the 6-1/2" width edges using a diagonal seam. Cut the strip into:

- (1) 6-1/2" x 49-1/2" (Section 3/Unit 3C)
- (1) 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" (Section 3/Unit 3A;  
Section 4/Unit 4D)
- (2) 6-1/2" x 8-1/2" (Section 3/Unit 3B)

Cut 3rd strip into:

- (1) 6-1/2" x 39-1/2" (Section 2/Unit 2A)

### Accent 1

(3) 1-1/2" x WOF strips

Sew strips together on the 1-1/2" width edges using diagonal seams. Cut this long strip into:

- (1) 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" (Section 1)
- (1) 1-1/2" x 41-1/2" (Section 1)
- (2) 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" (Section 2/Unit 2B;  
Section 4/Unit 4A)

### Accent 2

(5) 1-1/2" x WOF strips

Sew strips together on the 1-1/2" width edges using diagonal seams. Cut the strip into:

- (2) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" (Section 3/Unit 3A)
- (2) 1-1/2" x 65-1/2" (Section 3)
- (2) 1-1/2" x 8-1/2" (Section 4/Unit 4C)
- (2) 1-1/2" x 39-1/2" (Section 2/Unit 2A)

### Binding

(7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## FINISHING

1. **BACKING:** Remove all selvages, use 1/2" seam(s) to sew the pieces along the edge(s) to make one large piece, press all seam(s) open. Cut the backing into equal pieces and sew together along the longest edge(s).
2. **QUILTING:** Turn the backing so the seam(s) run in the appropriate direction(s) to take advantage of the quilt size, either horizontally or vertically. Layer in the batting and quilt it.
3. **BINDING:** Sew the strips end to end using diagonal seams. Fold in half lengthwise, wrong sides together, and press for a straight-grain French-fold binding. Attach to the top of the quilt by machine; turn to the back and blind stitch by hand.
4. **LABEL:** Add a label that has historical information on it like title, your name, date pieced, date finished, who quilted it, type of batting used.
