

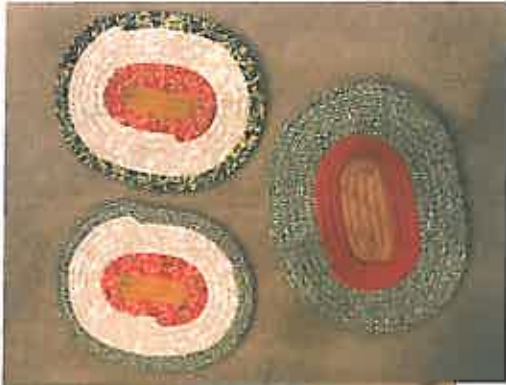
Jelly Roll Rug Class

Jelly-Roll Rugs are the latest craze and a lot of fun to make. There are many choices for you in this class.....Scotti will teach you the basics and some tricks to make your jelly roll rugs or placemats and you can go from there. These are a lot of fun to make and a bit addicting so beware!

Supply list:

- *Jelly-Roll Rug* Pattern by RJ Designs
- Sewing machine with an open foot or walking foot which will allow a zig-zag stitch about 5.0 mm wide. If you have an extension table for your machine be sure to bring it, or a box the height of your machine. You need a flat surface to hold the rug as it gets larger.
- 14-18 size Jeans needle
- Neutral thread which will match or blend with all your fabrics and several full matching bobbins. These rugs take a lot of thread.
- A stylus or long tweezers
- Seam ripper (of course we don't make mistakes!)
- Assorted WOF 22-1/2" strips of fabric (see below for quantities)
- 2-1/2" batting strips. If you are cutting your own batting cut slightly narrower as a full 2-1/2" strip will need to be overlapped. This is a good way to use up your scrap batting. Or purchase pre-cut batting rolls (Bosal Katahdin On-A-Roll 100% organic cotton blend is the cheapest I have found on Amazon). If you purchase the pre-cut rolls bring a large binding clip and a piece of string about 20" long to hang the roll on the edge of the table.
- At least a dozen small binding clips (clips are a must and work much better than pins to hold fabric and binding for this project).
- Rotary cutter, small cutting mat, scissors

Placemats 15" x 18"
9 or 10 2-1/2" WOF strips with 3 matching strips for border per placemat. You should be able to finish two placemats in class.

Enough batting for the strips.



½ jelly roll rug either oval or round:
Round is approximately 33"

½ jelly roll strips with equal batting (or one pre-cut jelly roll batting roll).

A full sized jelly roll rug measures approximately 29" x 43" and needs 44 strips and one and a half jelly roll batting rolls. You probably won't get a large rug finished during the class but will have all the tips to complete it at home.



Round jelly roll rug approximately 33"

Approximately 22 2-1/2" strips with at least 4 matching strips for border if you want it to match.

1 and ½ jelly roll batting rolls or enough strips for the 22 strips of fabric.
