

**Minutes of the Garland City Council meeting held October 26, 2016 at 8:06 pm at the Garland City Building with the following council members present:**

**Mayor Miller called the meeting to order. Council Member Bourne gave the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Council Member Bingham.**

**A motion to approve the agenda was made by Council Member Bourne. A second was made by Council Member Perry with all council members voting in favor of the motion.**

**A motion to approve the minutes from October 12, 2016 was made by Council Member Bourne. A second was made by Council Member Marble with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.**

**Mayor Miller asked if there were any requests for future agenda items. There were none.**

**Mayor Miller stated the next item on the agenda was new business and that Tyson was here to give us an update on the sewer projects.**

**Tyson stated that we have two contractors in town working on the sewer rehab project. He explained that Rupp's is in the area of 1025 South. He also explained that Propipe has been working on West Factory since about the first of October cleaning and cameraing the sewer lines. He stated Insituform was here last week and did six shots of sewer relining and then Propipe is back this week to finishing sealing the connections. He stated that a couple of the connections are going to have to be dug up and done because there is too much ground water coming in thru them to get a good seal with the robots.**

**He explained that he has a change order for somethings they did use and so extra things they needed for a total of about \$75,000. He went over some of the things they have done to save money for around a couple hundred thousand dollars. He also explained several things that will be coming that we will be able to save money on.**

**Mayor Miller stated that he would entertain a motion to approve the change order.**

**Council Member Marble made a motion to approve change order number 1 date of issuance October 10, 2016 for \$75,219.86. A second was made by Council Member Perry with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.**

**Mayor Miller stated the next item on the agenda was the reports of officers, boards and committees.**

**Fire Chief Rob Johnson reported burn permits are still going on for a little bit. He also stated that they had a small conflict with Tremonton and met with them last night to resolve it. He stated they will be meeting every couple of months for drills. He stated they are having issues with the squad which is their medical vehicle which will cost around \$3,000 to fix the transmission so they are holding off for a little bit to look at some other options. He reported that they finally found the problem with Engine 41 and put a temporary fix on it until the guy can come to fix it.**

Council Member Marble reported the sensors at the tanks have been replaced and the generator that was at the pump house is ready to be installed at the armory.

Council Member Perry asked Police Chief Chad Soffe if he had anything new. Chad reported that he has hired three part time officers to fill the afternoon shifts on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. They are Steven Downey and Chuck Hoffman from the county and Lee Sorensen who was a reserve officer has moved up to part time. He also stated the 2005 Impala had about \$800 in repairs this week. He also reported the school crossing at the high school is complete and it is bright and working.

Council Member Bourne stated that Cambria Deakin would be taking Tami Deakin's place as the youth council advisor. The youth council mayor is Jensen Hughes and she reported that they are kicking off the fill a truck fill a pantry tomorrow night. She also stated that they will not be doing the light parade anymore. She said they will be doing blankets for the hospital in January.

Council Member Bingham reported that wrestling has started and they have about a hundred kids and they will be starting youth basketball this year with USU.

Mayor Miller stated the next item on the agenda is the approval of the coding for accounts payable and payroll and asked if there were any questions.

Council Member Marble made a motion to approve the coding for payroll and accounts payable. A second was made by Council Member Bingham with all council members present voting in favor of the motion.

A motion to adjourn was made at 8:51 pm by Council Member Marble and seconded by Council Member Bingham. All council members present voted in favor of the motion.
