The Central Washington State Fair is September 19-28, and the guild plans to make our presence known. We will have our booth set up in the foyer of the Modern Living Building with a display of charity quilts donated by members. 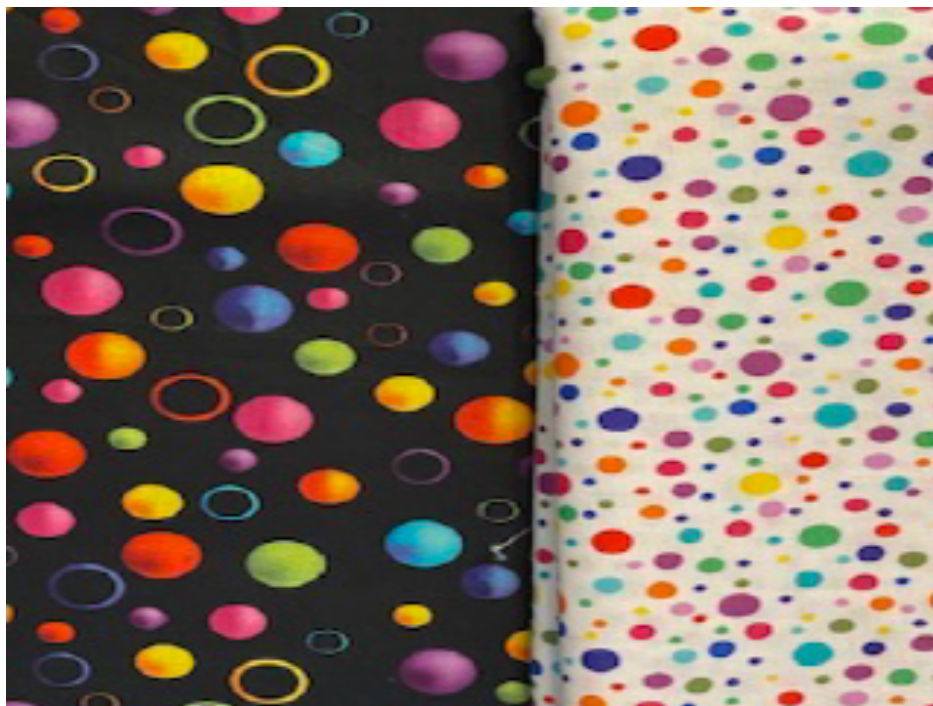

Learn to piece Seminole bands. This is a technique class that teaches students to piece 3 different Seminole designs. The finished bands can be added to quilts, clothing and home decor.



Crazy Quilt-As-You-Go \$50

Make a beautiful crazy quilt completely by machine. This is a great chance to use all those wonderful built-in stitches on your machine to embellish and quilt your blocks in one step. Each block is quilted individually then joined together with a special sashing technique.

Fabric will be sold at \$3 per pound. No need to mark the any thing fabric.

Please no polyester knit or magazines, these things do not sell. The Mission will take any polyester knit for the men's quilts they make.

If you are just not sure what something should be priced at bring it and we will help you on Friday. If you have items you think should be priced higher then use your own discretion. Remember people are looking for bargains and we don't want to have to haul a bunch of stuff away afterwards.
