Reach around and pat yourself on the back! Why? Because – in just the last 6 months of the last year, our Guild has given:

- 2 completed lap quilts, 2 baby quilts, and 1 twin quilt at our meetings
- 43 quilts to the Women's Shelter & Children's Village
- 55 Shoe Box quilts created; 32 completed
- 7 twins + 10 children's quilts are set aside for the YWCA addition
- 6 Children's quilts from the Fair Display will be shown at the Quilt Show in May
- \$237 cash donation to Rod's House, + \$166 cash donation to Union Gospel
- Many, many other donations for other worthy causes



PLUS....with just 33 members turning in their Volunteer Hours forms, 1,424 total hours were logged! (And – Just in case you haven't heard – the winner of the most hours logged was honored at our Christmas Party with a very nice prize! 200 hours! Impressive, to say the least! Way to go, Lois Dean!)

If you were one of the many who did NOT turn in your donated hours, the form can be found on our website; turn them in monthly to Kathy Winters at any meeting. We document these donations of works and hours to justify our tax-exempt status to both the IRS and the State of Washington when they check our records – they are important to them, as well as the lucky communities we serve.

Lisa Mortell Quilter

Lisa hails from NW Washington and in 2010 discovered her passion for quilting through a Kaffe Fassett book and by the time she completed her first quilt she was completely hooked. Over the past fourteen years her quilting journey has evolved significantly with a deepening love for hand appliqué with embroidery taking center stage. Lisa began teaching quilting techniques about six years ago including wool appliqué, needle-turn appliqué, paper piecing, and general quilting. She launched her wool appliqué patterns in 2024. Her recent works draw inspiration from the natural beauty of her Pacific Northwest roots, particularly the greater Seattle area. Notably, in November of 2024, Lisa's quilt Garden Friends was displayed at the prestigious 2024 Houston International Quilt Festival and won Second Place at Road to California. Her most current work, Nataliya will be at the 2025 Houston International Quilt Festival.

Lisa will be teaching a wool applique class to us. We need to vote on one of 3 designs.
