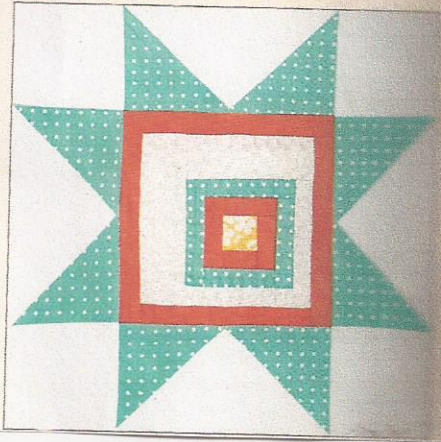


Starry Eyed

WHITE SOLID or WHITE on WHITE

- 1 sq (A) $7 \frac{1}{4} \times 7 \frac{1}{4}$
- 4 sq (C) $3 \frac{1}{2} \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$
- 1 rectangle (I) $1 \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$
- 1 rectangle (J) 1×4
- 1 rectangle (K) $1 \frac{3}{4} \times 4$
- 1 rectangle (L) $1 \frac{3}{4} \times 5 \frac{1}{4}$

BLUE PRINT

- 4 sq (B) $3 \frac{7}{8} \times 3 \frac{7}{8}$
- 1 rectangle (G) $1 \times 2 \frac{1}{2}$
- 2 rectangles (H) 1×3
- 1 rectangle (I) $1 \times 3 \frac{1}{2}$
- 1 sq (D) $1 \frac{1}{2} \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$

RED PRINT

- 1 rectangle (E) $1 \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$
- 2 rectangles (F) 1×2
- 1 rectangle (G) $1 \times 2 \frac{1}{2}$
- 1 rectangle (M) $1 \frac{1}{8} \times 5 \frac{1}{4}$
- 2 rectangles (N) $1 \frac{1}{8} \times 5 \frac{7}{8}$
- 1 rectangle (O) $1 \frac{1}{8} \times 6 \frac{1}{2}$

Using the $7 \frac{1}{4}$ in square and the 4 blue sq (B) make 4 flying geese. You may alter the block by using a red or blue $1 \frac{1}{2}$ in square in the center of the block (shown in the block picture in gold). If you use a red center square, use a blue or white rectangle (E) next to it and then a red in the next round. If some quilters alter the center square a little, it will make for a more interesting quilt.

Keep the stare points blue and the center square either red or blue (no gold). Alternate colors in the rounds of the center square.

Complete the center square and attach the flying geese and 3 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ in white squares to create the star.
