

## **Secretary Report**

SCCQG <u>Meeting Minutes for the April 18, 2009 Meeting</u>

President Kaaren Nowlin called the April 2009 meeting of Southern California Quilt Guilds to order, and thanked the hosting guild.

She reminded the group at large that board members are all volunteers and that several of the officers had been dealing with other problems since the last meeting including the death of newsletter chairperson, Kathryn Nolte's mother-in-law, secretary. Becky Miller's mother, and the death of her own husband just two weeks ago.

\$100 checks were presented in recognition of service to SCCQG and long time board members Jean Kuper, Sue Laughton, and LuJean Seagal.

SCCQG donated \$100 to the San Jose Museum of Quilting and Textiles for their continuing sponsorship and recognition of quilting and it's history in California.

It has also been decided that the July 11, 2009 SCCQG meeting and the October 10, 2009 meeting shall both be Meet the Teachers due to the growing number of individual members who wish to participate and present their lectures and programs. It is felt that making accessible the speakers and teachers in the area is a priority for SCCQG. The meetings will feature different possible speakers for the guilds to select for programs, if they desire. Jean Kuper will coordinate the program for both meetings and will send out invitation letters to all potential speakers. Speakers will be selected on a first come – first serve basis.

Don Beld reminded the group that the current financial report was published in the newsletter. He did explain the one item of taxes paid. In a previous year schedule A was not filed because all the answers were "No". Hence a fine. Don has filed the appropriate schedule, paid the fine, and requested a return of the money due to cause. Now we wait to hear from the government on this issue.

Kathryn Nolte requested all newsletter articles be sent to her the first week of June. If there is something interesting happening in your guild, write about it and it will be included in the news.

Kaarin reminded all that the insurance purchased for the guilds by SCCQG is Liability for guests of the guilds only and does not cover individual guild members. If your facility does not provide medical coverage and you are interested in obtaining medical coverage, please contact Kaarin.

Pam Overton took the floor to report on the Long Beach Quilt Festival in July. 22 guilds requested space for their Opportunity Quilts and 15 were selected due to space limitations. Guilds can buy advance purchase tickets for their members for \$8.00 each versus the normal \$10 admission at the show. Some of the quilt shops sponsoring the Quilt Festival will also have tickets available. They may be ordered thru the Festival website.
