For those guilds that have certs renewing, the process is underway. Invoices have been emailed to your guild president and/or treasurer/rep if those addresses were available to us. Please make your payment (\$10/certificate) in September. We will hold the checks and deposit after October 1.

The renewal certs will be issued as soon as the insurance company has a new policy number for us for the coming year. If you have an event coming up in the first week or so of the policy, please ensure that we have your facility contact's email address so that the cert can be emailed vs. snail mailed. If your cert is a "proof of insurance with additional insured" please provide a new contract/agreement to us. The insurance company requires that we forward that to them ASAP.

Do you have an event coming up? Take a minute now to a) check to see if your facility requires an insurance certs and b) request that cert now – well in advance of your event. Saves your guild \$\$\$ and checks off one important thing from your TO DO list! Most of the guilds are planning well in advance and following up with me until their cert is issued. Teamwork makes this job easier for all of us! Thanks!

We encourage you to list your events on the SCCQG Calendar of Events. I see a lot of cert requests for quilt shows, teas, etc. that are NOT on the calendar! You're missing an opportunity for free advertising.

News from around the Council

ACACIA QUILT GUILD DONATES 36 QUILTS TO LOCAL FIREFIGHTERS

Acacia Quilt Guild of Orange County, based in Buena Park, was honored and pleased to present 36 quilts to the firefighters of Fire House 61 at the grand opening of the new fire house in July 2018.

Buena Park Fire House 61 was destroyed by fire in January 2017. There had been plans to build a new firehouse in a few years’ time but with the destruction, the various government agencies decided to immediately begin construction on a new firehouse which was completed in Spring 2018.

Beth Swift, Acacia Member and former Buena Park mayor, proposed that the guild make quilts for the residents of the new firehouse since they lost many personal belongings including quilts. Beth was also Chair of the Orange County Fire Authority. The members of Acacia were happy to take on this project and make quilts for those who do so much for the community and for the state in general.

Fire House 61 celebrated its grand opening on July 11, 2018. Several Acacia guild members were present. A total of 34 XL twin bed quilts and 34 pillow cases were donated to the fire fighters. An additional t-shirt quilt made with donated firehouse t-shirts was made for display in the new fire house. Furthermore, Barbara Parks, Acacia friend and quilter in several Orange County guilds, made a special 9/11 Firefighter wall hanging that was presented to the Fire Chief to symbolically represent all of the quilts being donated.

Acacia's generosity was reported in the local press including the Orange County Register as well as TV channel ABC7 news.



I recently received the following letter from Road to California regarding their continuing philanthropic program Roadies Give Back.

Thank-you to SCCQG for supporting the event Roadies Give Back that will be at Road to California 2019. Roadies Give Back supports the Robert and Beverly Lewis Cancer Center at Pomona Valley Hospital. The purpose of the program is to donate a quilt for a patient to keep and cuddle under during his or her cancer treatment.

Roadies Give Back will be listed in the classes available at the 2019 show. The class will be

January 26, 2019, from 6 - 9 p.m. Please bring basic sewing supplies as we will have machines on site to use. There will be food to nibble on and some surprises as well.

Please check with your Council representatives for the information and the pattern that was provided for each guild at Meet the Teachers. The pattern is X's and O's which works up beautifully in 5" square medium brights with 2 1/2" Kona black snowballs on the upper right corner and the lower left corner.

The hope is, we as quilters can help make cancer patients more comfortable during their treatment and let them know there are folks who may not know the patient but who cares about them.


