

Petit Point

Fabric requirements

based on fabric at least 42" wide; refer to diagram one when selecting fabric

- background, first and third borders (fabric A) — 1-1/2 yards
- medium value (fabric B) — 3/8 yard
- darkest value and binding (fabric C) — 5/8 yard
- brightest value and second border (fabric D) — 3/8 yard
- backing — 1-1/4 yards if fabric is at least 45" wide;
2-1/2 yards if it is not at least 45" wide

Cut — read all directions before beginning

fabric A — cut six strips 3-1/2" x wof* (blocks and lattice strips); from

two of these strips cut six rectangles 3-1/2" x 8" (lattice)

— cut four strips 3-3/4" by wof (third border strips)

— cut six strips 2" x wof (blocks and first border)

fabric B — cut five strips 2" x wof (blocks)

fabric C — cut three strips 2" x wof (blocks)

fabric D — cut five strips 2" x wof (blocks and second border)

* wof — width of fabric

Directions — all seams are 1/4"

1. Use two strips 3-1/2" x wof of fabric A and one strip 2" x wof of fabric B to make band one. Refer to diagram two for placement. Press seams down. From band one, cut 18 pieces 2" x 8". Refer to diagram two.
2. Use two strips 2" x wof each of fabric A and fabric B, and one strip 2" x wof of fabric C to make band two. Refer to diagram two for placement. Press seams up. From band two, cut 18 pieces 2" x 8". Refer to diagram two.
3. Use two strips 2" x wof each of fabric B and fabric C, and one strip 2" x wof of fabric D to make band three. Refer to diagram two for placement. Press seams down. From band three, cut nine pieces 2" x 8". Refer to diagram two.
4. To construct the blocks, use two pieces from band one, two pieces from band two and one piece from band three. Refer to diagram three for placement. Make nine blocks.
5. Use three blocks and two 3-1/2" x 8" rectangles to make a row. Make three rows. Refer to diagram four.
6. Use two strips 3-1/2" x wof for the lattice and refer to diagram four to construct the quilt center. Then, one at a time, sew first, second and third border strips onto the quilt center. Refer to diagram five.
7. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

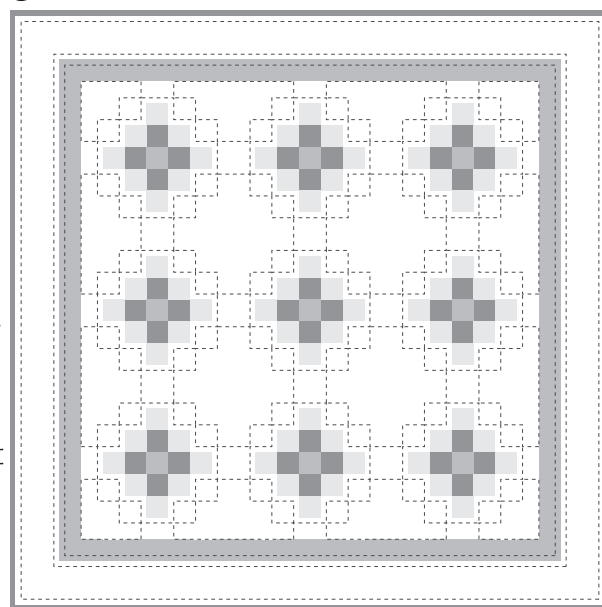

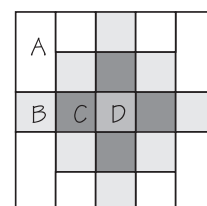

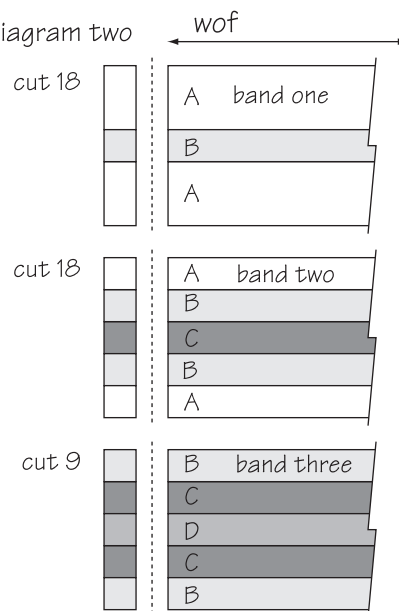
