## Supplies needed - 40 " wide fabric

- pinwheels - two fat quarters: one light and one dark - darker strips - 3/4 yard of one fabric or a minimum of six pre-cut strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ wof* (even more strips offer more variety)
- lighter strips - 3/4 yard of one fabric or a minimum of seven pre-cut strips 2.5" x wof* (even more strips offer more variety)
- border - $1 / 2$ yard
-binding - $1 / 2$ yard
- backing - 1-1/4 yards

Cut - read all directions before beginning and refer to diagram one
darker strips — piece A: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 4.5^{\prime \prime}$
piece B: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$
piece E: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece F: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece I: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece J: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ lighter strips — piece C: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece D: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece G: cut four strips 2.5" x 10.5" piece H: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece K: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 14.5^{\prime \prime}$ piece L: cut four strips $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 16.5^{\prime \prime}$ border — cut four strips 3.75" x wof*
*w.o.f. — width of fabric

## Directions

All seams are 1/4"

1. Using the two fat quarters and your favorite halfsquare triangle construction method, make 20 half-square triangles to finish at $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}\right.$ unfinished).
2. Sew four pinwheel blocks using four half-square triangles each. See diagram two for placement.
3. Attach the remaining four half-square triangles on to the right-hand side of the four strips piece J. See diagram three.
4. Following diagram one, sew one piece $A$ on to the right-
diagram three
 hand side of one pinwheel block.
5. Continue following diagram one and sew pieces $B$ through L clock-wise from the center out to construct one block.
6. Repeat steps 4 and 5 and construct three more blocks.
7. Refer to the main drawing, rotate your four blocks clock-wise and sew the blocks together forming the quilt center.
8. Sew the border strips on to the edges of the quilt center. Trim ends as needed.
9. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy.

## More ideas:

-To make a Christmas tree skirt, omit the center pinwheel and cut the four of piece J at 2.5 " x 14.5". Construct "Whatever the season" as described above, then cut a hole in the center.

- This is the perfect size to celebrate the arrival of a special little one - pink or blue always works, or try a newer color combination: blue and brown, gray and yellow or shades of neutrals.
- Reverse the placement of the dark and light strips.

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
