T-Shirt Quilt Class—Supply List

This class will give you placement tips, layout ideas, block preparation, and lots of tips and tricks to help empty those drawers or tubs full of old t-shirts and make a keepsake t-shirt quilt.

You will learn how to determine what shirts to use and how to arrange them for the most appealing look. And how to prepare the cut pieces so they are more like fabric and avoid the stretch.

We will not be making a whole quilt, just learning how to get it all together. You'll leave saying..."Hey, I can do this!!"

SUPPLY LIST:

- Rotary cutter with sharp blade
- 24" ruler
- 12" or 14" square ruler (not required but very helpful)
- Fabric scissors
- 3-4 t-shirts (sweatshirts, sports uniform shirts, baby clothes can also be used) (if you already have all the shirts you are wanting to use, bring them all)
- Shape-Flex (SF 101) fusible interfacing-at least 2 yards
- (Some folks prefer the non-woven soft 906F interfacing)
- Fabric for sashing (if you are planning on putting sashing)
- Sewing Machine with foot control and power cord
- Standard presser foot or walking foot
- Universal 80/12 needles
- Thread
- General sewing supplies
