

Anita Goodesign Lace Lantern

Supply List

This will be a two-session class and will require some homework in order to finish the project.

In the first class we will cut out the stiffener and fabric pieces and should be able to start embroidering

In the second class we will work on finishing any embroidering and start assembly. The homework will be the additional pieces we don't get done in class #1, but if you don't finish at home, don't worry we will work on it in the second class and I will show you how to assemble

Bring:

Brother Scan N Cut machine with power cord and accessories (if you have one, if you don't that is ok I will have the pieces for you to cut it out by hand). The cut files for the SNC is missing so I will have those, bring a USB drive to transfer the files

Standard cutting mat, Painter or Drafting tape, Deep cut holder and Blade***

Spatula and Stylus that came with Scan N Cut Scissors

Sewing machine with power cord and with embroidery arm and foot

Embroidery Hoops 9.5 x 14 for the large lantern or 8 x 12 for the small lantern

Open toe foot (available at RSC in most cases)

2 spools embroidery thread—you will need to make bobbins with the same thread you embroider with and will use 2 spools on the large and 1 ½ on the small lantern

Empty bobbins rotary cutter and ruler (45mm rotary cutter suggested and 24" X 6" ruler)

Seam ripper is needed to tear away the fabric for the lace inset

Scissors and basic sewing supplies

Temporary spray adhesive*** i.e. KK100 Embroidery needles***

Tape – Florinani pink tape is perfect for this***

Fabrics:

Large

Exterior Fabric – ¾ yard***

Interior Fabric – ¾ yard***

Lace – 1/3 yard (available at Joanns)

Stiffener – 1 ½ yards***

Tear Away Stabilizer***

Small

Exterior Fabric – ½ yard***

Interior Fabric – ½ yard***

Lace – 1/3 yard

Stiffener – 1 ½ yards***

Tear Away Stabilizer***

I used the same fabric for my exterior and interior pieces of the lantern. The fabric should have a pattern of some sort on it as the only embroidery is on the one panel at the top and around the openings to secure the lace.
