

HOLIDAY DRESDEN VILLAGE

Please select Halloween or Christmas design, Instructions will be provided in class. We will be showing a different method than that used for traditional Dresden plate construction. However, if you wish to use traditional method, we will demonstrate how to make your Dresden lay flat.



SUPPLY LIST

Background fabric, batting & backing - 1 yard each

Binding - 1/2 yard

Hot Fix Adhesive - 1 yard

- This is a permanent fusible adhesive made for raw edge applique (fabric edges will not ravel).
- NOTE: Can use other Fusible such as Steam A Seam II Lite instead, if desired.

Dresden plate & design elements - Please bring fabrics in holiday theme of your choice.

- Dresden plate - You will need 12 or 20 different fabrics for the Dresden plate blades & rooftops (fat quarters, fat eighths, or 1/8-1/4 yard cuts). It is suggested that you bring several pieces and share. For the 12-blade version, 1/8 yard is not quite wide enough for the taller blades (blade is 6.25" wide at top). However, for the shorter blades, it will be enough.
- Design elements - Any fabrics with shapes or words in keeping with your chosen holiday can be used to fuse or glue to your project.
- Various rooftop & other miscellaneous holiday design shapes will be provided for you to use with the Brother Scan & Cut. One will be available if you do not have or do not wish to bring your own.

Sewing machine, cord & accessories (If you are using embroidery, do at home or bring embroidery unit)

NOTE: You may not need your sewing machine until Class #2. You will be planning, cutting, laying out & fusing your design in Class #1.

Threads - embroidery in colors to match or coordinate with your holiday choice; quilting thread for quilting.

Scissors – small, preferably with very fine serrated blades for gripping the fabric; this allows for accurate cutting of small pieces. Karen Kay Buckley or Appliquick work well.

Standard sewing notions (straight pins/fabric marking pen/extra needles/rulers/etc.)

Rotary cutter & ruler

Dresden ruler

- 30° ruler makes 12 blades (Susan Cleveland recommended)
- 18° ruler makes 20 blades (Sample shown has 20)

Steady Betty or Wool pressing mat to prevent stretching (If you have one)

Applique pressing sheet or sheet of parchment paper for use with fusibles

Optional but highly recommended items...

Terrial Magic (stiffens fabric to a paper-like consistency – very crisp, great for raw edge applique or attaching small pieces for design elements.

Fabric glue (Roxanne's Glue Baste-It is recommended; holds well & **does not show through fabric**)

Every item on the above Supply List can be purchased from Richland Sewing Center

Pool noodle - available at dollar stores... An inexpensive item that can be cut to any desired length & used to roll project up on & pin. Avoids wrinkling.
