

Off Kilter Lap Quilt

The frames created are the perfect space for focus fabric designs, fabric printed photos, or embroidered pieces. Pick your favorite: Cats, Dogs, Hearts, Flowers, Seasonal Themes, Photos for Wedding or Baby Showers, or Make it a Signature Friendship Quilt.

The finished size at 40" X 40" incorporates 16 frames holding 5-1/2" design squares to center Off-Kilter, and are sashed with coordinating fabrics, then layered with a thin batting, outline quilted by machine and bound with purchased or handmade binding. Let the print shown in the sample be an inspiration for your own creation – just a bit Off-Kilter!

Fabric Needed: 100% Cotton Fabrics are preferred. (Please pre-wash and iron with a spray sizing to give body and drape over hanger to reduce folds while carrying to class)

- 1/2 to 3/4 Yard of Center Block Fabric (depending upon spacing repeat of theme print)
- 1/3 Yard Each of **4** Different Complimentary Fabrics for Frames
- 3/4 Yard of Coordinating Sashing Fabric
- 2-- 3 yard packages of pre-packaged binding tape for outer edges of quilt. OR, Self-Made bias binding at least 3" wide X 180" long
- Thin Cotton Batting for Lap Quilt, OR, Thermo-Lam Fleece Batting for Wall Quilt – 50" X 50"
- 1-1/4 Yards of Backing Fabric
- Delaying purchase of Border Fabric until top is completed is recommended

Supplies Needed:

- Your Sewing Machine with a new #12/80 Universal or Quilting Needle, plus machine manual
- 100% Cotton Thread for piecing (50 weight) in neutral color to coordinate with fabrics

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Supplies Needed Continued:

- 2 pre-filled bobbins of coordinating thread.
- Rotary Cutter – 45 mm Blade
- Cutting Mat – 19" X 23" or larger
- Acrylic Rulers – 6" X 12" or 4 1/4" x 14" and an 8" or 12" square ruler
- Glass-head pins, 1-3/8" X .05 fine
- Small scissors or snips
- Fabric Scissors
- Fine point seam ripper
- Fine (.05) lead marking pencil for Fabric
- Seam gauge (approx. 6" measuring device with a slider)
- A stiletto or "That Purple Thang" to guide pieces through machine
- Cloth measuring tape

Optional Supplies

- 1/4" foot for machine
- Helpful Items: Travel iron with steam and a small pressing mat
- (June Tailor Cut & Press#2 works well)
- Flat box like a small shirt box or a new pizza box in which to lay the strips when they are cut. This makes it easier to construct the blocks quickly in an assembly line method of stitching.
