Routine (Basic) Service outline

This is for a machine that has been used in recent months and serviced on a fairly regular basis. If it hasn't been used for years, kerosene may be needed, and that's a restoration.

Before removing parts, how is it running?
 Machines can get noisier when they get dry and need oil

2. Remove parts and assess condition of basic areas:

Top plate with spool pin

Faceplate

Presser foot, needle, Throat Plate, bobbin case

Motor area, belt pulley, motor brush check

Bottom plate (drip pan)

- 3. Cleaning one area at a time using cleaning supplies and oil and lube where needed. (as specified in the manual)
 - a. Bottom plate drip pad may need to be replaced
 - b. Throat plate area
 - c. Face plate area
 - d. Top of machine head oiling and gears
 - e. Motor area check top brush and pulley, clean, lube
- 4. Replace the cover plates, polish the surface with oil
- 5. Run the motor and hear the purr! Test the stitch.
