#### **Dies Needed:**

**GO! Deer Head (55613)** 

**GO! Northwoods Medley (55483)** 

GO! Square-8-1/2" (8" Finished) (55058)

GO! Big Square-10-1/2" (10" Finished) (55592)

#### **Optional Dies:**

GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55017 or 55014) OR GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/4" (1-3/4" Finished) (55053)

#### **Fabric Requirements:**

Fabric Color	Total Yardage	
Tan Tweed	3/4 yard	
Tan Plaid	1 yard	
Houndstooth Red	3/4 yard	
Red Plaid	3/4 yard	
Black Texture	1-1/4 yard	
Fusible for applique shapes	2 yards (12" wide)	

ADD: 1/2 Yard for binding and 3-1/2 Yards for backing\*

GO! Dec Black Texture (55613)	GO! Deer Head	CUT 1 – 7" WOF strip Apply fusible to back

Black Texture	GO! Northwoods Medley (55483)	CUT 1 – 2-1/2" WOF strip CUT 1 – 2-1/2" X 21" strip Apply fusible to backs CUT 12 Trees
Black Texture	GO! Northwoods Medley (55483)	CUT 1 – 5" WOF strip Apply fusible to back Fold strip in half. CUT 3 LEFT and 3 RIGHT facing moose Total = 6 shapes
Black Texture	GO! Northwoods Medley (55483)	CUT 1 – 3-1/4 WOF strip Apply fusible to back Fold strip in half. CUT 2 LEFT and 3 RIGHT facing bears Total = 5 shapes
GO! Square-8- Tan Tweed 1/2" (8" Finished)	CUT 2 – 9" WOF strips CUT 1 – 9" X 9" piece	
	(55058) GO! Big Square-	CUT 9 squares CUT 2 – 11" WOF strips
Tan Plaid 10-	10-1/2" (10" Finished) (55592)	CUT 1 – 11" X 11" piece  CUT 9 squares
Red Houndstooth	Rotary cut	CUT 9 - 8-1/2" X 10-1/2" rectangles per color.

### **Sewing Tips & Directions:**







Use a ¼ seam allowance.

Do NOT apply the applique pieces onto the fabric until the blocks have been sewn into strips. Blocks are rotated in various directions, so it is difficult to keep track of "which side is up" before the rows are sewn.

All appliques were applied raw edge.

I did not embroider the edges as I planned to sew them down during the "quilting" process.

If you are sending your quilt out to be quilted, then it is recommended that you stitch down all your applique pieces using either a blanket stitch on your sewing machine or download the free embroidery stitches from AccuQuilt and use one of them to finish the edges.



#### 1. Make the 4 patch blocks. 18" Finished Block Make 9 Blocks total

Use all the CUT squares and rectangles from the tan and red fabrics.

SEW 1 Tan Tweed 8-1/2" cut square to 1 Red Houndstooth 8-1/2" X 10-1/2" cut rectangle.



SEW 1 Red Check 8-1/2" X 10-1/2" cut rectangle to 1 Tan Check 10-1/2" cut square.



Sew the two sections together into a 4 patch.




#### 2. Assembling the ROWS of the Quilt Top:







- This Quilt is sewn in 3 rows of 3 18" blocks each.
- Follow the diagram below to assemble each ROW, making sure to rotate the blocks to get the correct orientation.
- SEW only the ROWS
- Do NOT sew the rows together



### 3. Adding the Applique shapes to the ROWS


- Peel the backing off the applique shape.
- Position the shape in the center of the designated fabric unit, see next places for all placements.
- Make sure it is even all the way around.
- Using a hot iron fuse, the shape in place.
- Repeat until all applique shapes have been added.
- Stitch all shapes in place (or you can sew them down freehand if you are doing the quilting) yourself.

## 5. Sew the Rows together

Sew Row 1 and 2 together, then sew Row 3 to the bottom





## **Finishing your Quilt:**

- Layer batting between quilt top and backing. 1.
- Pin or baste layers together.
- Quilt as desired. 3.
- Add Binding 4.
