



# **GO!** Bow Tie by Chris Marchini of Rose City Originals Finished Size: Various Sizes

### **Dies Needed:**

GO! Bow Tie by Chris Marchini (55270)

## **Fabric Requirements:**

Fabric Color	Total Yardage	
Main Fabric	1/4 yard, or One Fat Quarter	
June Tailor T-Shirt Project Interfacing	1/4 yard	
Hook & Loop Tape	3" of 3/4" or 5/8" Hook & Loop Tape	

## **Cutting Directions:**

WOF = Width of Fabric (from selvage to selvage)

Fabric Color	Die	Number of Shapes to Cut
Main Fabric	GO! Bow Tie by Chris Marchini (55270)	Pre-Fuse interfacing to the wrong side of the fabric and rough-cut into Two, 7" x 21-1/2" pieces. Press in half lengthwise, right sides together, and place over die board to cut Four Bow Tie shapes.
Hook & Loop Tape		Use scissors or rotary cutter to trim Hook & Loop tape to 3" in length.





## **Sewing Directions:**


All seams are sewn at 1/4", unless otherwise indicated.


#### Sewing your Bow Tie

- Follow cutting instructions above to cut Four Bow Tie shapes.
  - a. The finished Bow Tie will be adjustable with the hook & loop tape, but you can also use the chart below to cut the shapes shorter for smaller necks.

Left Length (2 each)	Right Length (2 each)	Collar Size (Approx.)
Full Size	Full Size	19" – 24"
Full Size	Guide Mark 1	17 ½" – 22 ½"
Guide Mark 1	Guide Mark 1	16" – 21"
Guide Mark 1	Guide Mark 2	14 ½" – 19 ½"
Guide Mark 2	Guide Mark 2	13" – 18"
Guide Mark 2	Guide Mark 3	11 ½" – 16 ½"
Guide Mark 3	Guide Mark 3	10" – 15"
Guide Mark 3	Guide Mark 4	8 ½" – 13 ½"
Guide Mark 4	Guide Mark 4	7" – 12"

- 2. With right sides together, stitch around the Bow Tie shapes, leaving the space between the two notches unsewn.
- 3. Turn Bow Tie shapes right side out and use a point turner or chopstick to help with the corners.
  - a. If cutting a shorter length, clip the corners on the short end before turning.
- 4. Fold raw edges of opening in by 1/4" and top-stitch to secure.
- 5. Top stitch one side of the Hook & Loop tape to the skinny end of the Bow Tie shape.










6. Repeat with 2<sup>nd</sup> side of the Bow Tie.




#### Tying the Bow Tie

NOTE: This is an easy method for tying when the Bow Tie ends are not already connected. You can also use a traditional tying method if you prefer.


- 1. With the Hook & Loop tape facing up, fold the Bow Tie at the apex of the first bump as shown.
- 2. With the Hook & Loop side facing down, place the second side on top so that the apex of the first bump aligns with wide end of the first piece as shown.



3. Fold the tail of the second side up at a 90° angle, so that it aligns with the dip in the center of the bow as shown.




4. Fold the second side over at the apex of the first bump as shown.







5. Fold the second side down, toward the back side as shown.



6. Fold the tail of the second side up, across the front of the bow as shown.



- 7. Feed the tail of the second side underneath the loop created on the back and pull to tighten.
  - a. The hook & loop tape should be visible on opposite sides as shown.



8. Play around with the knot and bow until you get your desired look and it's ready to wear.
