## Fabric Requirements:

Dark Orange	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Medium Dark Orange	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Medium Light Orange	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Light Orange	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Light Blue	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard
Dark Blue	$\frac{1}{2}$ yard
Dark Purple	$\frac{1}{3}$ yard
Medium Purple	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Light Purple	$\frac{1}{4}$ yard
Backing	$\frac{2}{3}$ yard

## Cutting Directions:

Fabric Color	Die	Number of Shapes to Cut
Dark Orange	GO! Grandmother's Fan-9" Finished (55537)	Cut one 7-3/4" x 5-1/2" rectangle. Lay so that it covers two Blade B shapes. Cut two.
Medium Dark Orange	GO! Grandmother's Fan-9" Finished (55537)	Cut one 7-3/4" x 5-1/2" rectangle. Lay so that it covers two Blade B shapes. Cut two.
Medium Light Orange	GO! Grandmother's Fan-9" Finished (55537)	Cut one 7-3/4" x 7-3/4" rectangle. Lay so that it covers all three Blade B shapes. Cut three Cut one 7-3/4" x 3-1/2" rectangle. Lay so that it covers one Blade B shape. Cut one. Total of four Shape B.
Light Orange	GO! Grandmother's Fan-9" Finished (55537)	Cut one 7-3/4" x 7-3/4" rectangle. Lay so that it covers all three Blade B shapes. Cut three Cut one 7-3/4" x 3-1/2" rectangle. Lay so that it covers one Blade B shape. Cut one. Total of four Shape B.
Light Blue	GO! Grandmother's Fan-9" Finished (55537)	Cut one 10" x WOF strip. Subcut into one 10" x 20" rectangle, set remaining fabric aside. Fold in half. Lay so that it covers Shape A and Shape C blades. Cut for a total of two Shape A and two Shape C
	GO! Strip Cutter-1-1/2" (1" Finished) (55024)	Take remaining strip from above. Lay on blades to cut four 1-1/2" strips. Trim two strips to 9-1/2" and two strips to 10-1/2"
Dark Blue	GO! New York Beauty-9" Finished (55932)	Cut one 10-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut into one 10-1/2" x 21" rectangle, set remaining fabric aside. Fold in half. Lay on Shape C blade and cut two Shape C. From remaining fabric cut one 4-1/2" x 9" rectangle and one 4-1/4" x 11" rectangle. Fold the 4-1/2" x 9" rectangle in half and lay on Shape A blade. Cut two Shape A. Fanfold the 4-1/4" x 11" rectangle into four 2-3/4" widths. Lay on Shape E Blade. Cut for a total of four Shape E. Cut one 4-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut into one 4-1/4" x 21" and one 4-1/4" x 7" rectangles. Fanfold the larger strip into four 3-1/2" widths. Fold the smaller one in half. Lay on Shape F Blade. Cut for a total of eight Shape F.
	GO! Strip Cutter-1-1/2" (1"	Fold fabric selvedge to selvedge. Lay on Blade to cut one 1-1/2" strip. Subcut the strip into two 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangles and two 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" rectangles.



Dark Purple	GO! New York Beauty-9" Finished (55932)	Cut one 10" x WOF strip. Subcut into one 10" x 21" rectangle. Fold in half. Lay on the Shape B Blade. Cut for two Shape B.
Medium Purple	GO! New York Beauty-9" Finished (55932)	Cut one 4" by WOF strip. Subcut into one 4" x 15" rectangle and one 4" x 10" rectangle. Fanfold strips into 2-1/2" widths. Place on Shape G Blade. Cut for ten Shape G.
Light Purple	GO! New York Beauty-9" Finished (55932)	Cut one rectangle 5-3/4" x 11-1/2". Fold in half. Lay on Shape D Blade. Cut for two Shape D.


## Sewing Directions:

Use  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams, unless otherwise indicated.


1. Arrange the shades of orange fabric Shape B from the Grandmother's Fan BOB as shown. Stitch together to create a fan shape.




2. Lay fan shape on top of A quarter circle shape, right sides together, matching notches. Pin together at notches. Aligning raw edges, match L corners and pin. Match R corners and pin. Matching raw edges; add pins, as needed to ensure a smooth seam.



- Using a consistent  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance and matching notches, sew C shape to completed arch unit. Stretch or ease fabrics as needed. Block should measure 9-1/2" square.




- Lay one 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" light blue rectangle to the side of the block and one 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" light blue rectangle to the top of the block. Stitch the rectangles to the block as shown.




- Repeat Steps 1-4 to create a second Grandmother's Fan block.
- Gather the dark blue Shape E and Shape F and the medium purple Shape G from the New York Beauty Block. Arrange as shown. Stitch together.



7. With right sides together and matching notches, align raw edge of the light purple Shape D's small curved edge to raw edge of the dark blue Shape A's curved edge. Add pins and ease fabric as needed, to ensure a smooth seam. Sew Shape D and A together using a consistent  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.




8. Using the same process as step 7, with right sides together and matching notches, align E/F/G unit to A/D unit as shown. Add pins and ease fabrics as needed to ensure a smooth seam. Sew together using a consistent  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



9. Using the same process as previous steps, with right sides together and matching notches, align the dark purple Shape B to E/F/G unit as shown. Add pins and ease fabric as needed to ensure a smooth seam. Sew together using a consistent  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



10. Using the same process as previous steps, with right sides together and matching notches, align the dark blue Shape C to Shape B as shown. Add pins and ease fabric as needed to ensure a smooth seam. Sew together using a consistent  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Block should measure 9-1/2" square.




11. Lay one 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" dark blue rectangle to the side of the block and one 1-1/2" x 10-1/2" dark blue rectangle to the top of the block. Stitch the rectangles to the block as shown.




12. Repeat steps 6-11 to create a second New York Beauty Block.

## Assemble the Quilt Top


1. Lay out blocks as shown.



2. Sew blocks together into rows.



3. Sew rows together.




4. Add batting and quilt if desired. Trim.

## Pillow Finishing

*Note: Quilting may shrink the pillow top. Measure the trimmed piece and change the backing fabric as needed.*



1. Cut the backing fabric into two 20-1/2" x 15" rectangles
2. Fold a long edge  $\frac{1}{2}$ " over, wrong sides together and press. Fold again  $\frac{1}{2}$ " and press again. Repeat on the second rectangle.




3. Top stitch the hems just shy of  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the edge.




4. Lay pillow top right side up. Place one backing rectangle right side down, with the hemmed side toward the middle of the pillow and the raw edges matching. Place the second backing rectangle at the other side of pillow top, right sides together with the hemmed side toward the middle of the pillow and raw edges matching.



5. Stitch around all four sides using a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



6. Carefully trim corners, being careful to not cut into the seam allowance.



7. Turn the pillowcase right side out and insert the pillow.
