## Dies Needed:

GO! Arkansas Traveler-12" Finished (55558)
GO! Strip Cutter-2-1/2" (2" Finished) (55107 or 55014)

## Fabric Requirements:

| Fabric Color | Total Yardage |

| 12 different scraps | See cutting below |
| Off White | $1 / 2$ yard |
| Binding | $1 / 3$ yard |
| Batting | $16^{\prime \prime} \times 54^{\prime \prime}$ |
| Backing | $18^{\prime \prime} \times 56^{\prime \prime}$ |

## Cutting Directions:

| Fabric Color | Die | Number of Shapes to Cut |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 4 Larger Scraps (dark blue, light green, light blue, turquoise) | GO! Arkansas <br> Traveler-12" <br> Finished <br> (55558) (Shape <br> A) | Cut $7-3 / 4$ " $\times 12$ " scraps of each. Fold in half. Sub cut into 8 of each Shape A diamonds. |
| 8 Smaller Scraps (pink, light yellow, orange, grey, dark yellow, red, purple, dark green) | GO! Arkansas <br> Traveler-12" <br> Finished (55558) (Shape A) | Cut $7-3 / 4$ " $\times 6$ " scraps of each. Sub cut into 4 of each Shape A diamonds. |
| Off white | GO! Arkansas <br> Traveler-12" <br> Finished (55558) (Shape C) | Cut 2—7" WOF (width of fabric) strips. Fan fold into 4" width. Sub cut into 16-isosceles triangles. |
| Off white | GO! Arkansas <br> Traveler-12" <br> Finished (55558) (Shape B) | Cut 1-4" WOF strip. Fan fold into 2-3/4" width. Sub cut into 32-half rectangle triangles. (Also use leftovers from above if needed.) |

## Sewing Directions:

Press all seams open and use $1 / 4$ " seams, unless otherwise indicated.

## Arkansas Traveler Block

NOTE: Directions will be for one 12" finished block. Make 4 blocks.

1. Sew three colors of Shape A diamonds together, having one fabric repeat as shown. Make four units.
2. Sew diamonds together into a large diamond block section. Make four units.

3. Sew white Shapes $B$ and $B r$ (reversed) to the sides of diamond sections. Make four units.

4. Sew white Shape C isosceles triangle to one side of diamond section. Make four units.

5. Sew two of these units together. Make two units.

6. Sew two half block units together to make block.
7. Make four different blocks total.

8. Sew blocks together into a row of four blocks.


## Quilting and Finishing

1. Layer batting between quilt top and backing.
2. Pin or baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Add binding, mitering corners.
