Mayor Weston called our meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Porter Weston addressed the board about his acceptance to the Governor's Honor's Academy this summer at SUU in Cedar City. He will receive 6 college credits and an offer of a 4-year scholarship to SUU for his attendance at the 10-day event. As part of his requirements, he is to find sponsorship for his \$1100 tuition. He was there to ask the board for support. After a few questions and a brief discussion, a motion was made by Bridget, seconded by Brian and approved by the board unanimously to provide \$400 toward his goal. He thanked the board for their support and promised to report his experience and then left the meeting.

Verdis Winder, a Randolph Cub Scout, was to our meeting to ask the board if we could enter into an agreement with the State of Utah to provide support for crossing flags at the 3 striped intersections of State Highway 16 and local roads, Canyon, Church, and Park Streets. His Cub Scout Troop would provide the holders for the flags and get them put up, if the town could buy the flags and accept the agreement. The Mayor had been in touch with UDOT and they were in support of this project. The State may require a traffic survey and would monitor if the flags caused more or fewer accidents. It was a consensus opinion that the flags would make a pedestrian more visible to oncoming traffic. Melanie made the motion that we support the Scouts in this endeavor and Bridget seconded, approved by the board unanimously.

We discussed the water pipe replacement project that we would like to do this summer. Because the engineers we had hired felt it unnecessary to replace the complete water line, Bryan and the boys will investigate working on each hook up individually and replacing needed pipes.

We will be moving the DUP sign one block to the South.

Lana read the February and March meeting minutes. February was moved to be approved by Brian with Melanie seconding, approved unanimously. The March minutes were moved to be approved by Bridget with Melanie seconding, approved unanimously.

Lana then read all the bills for February and March, Bridget moved to approve payment with Brian seconding, approved unanimously.

Brian Weyers stated that he had been approached by the Town of Woodruff to be their water systems operator. They had been unable to get a certified operator for their system. He would be responsible for sending in their water samples and maintenance of their system. The board felt that it would be fine with them if he did that, but felt it would be fair for Woodruff to pay some of his expenses for training and paper work that he did each year on their behalf. Brian would talk to Mayor Homan concerning this agreement.

The Mayor presented the Wilford Woodruff House sprinkler system plans that Bryan Thomson had had drawn up. The cost for the plan was \$250 but \$100 would be deducted from the parts bill if we used Peterson Plumbing for our supplies. The board thought it looked very professional and that we should go ahead with the project.

Bryan is repairing the roads around town with some cold mix asphalt he recently purchased.

There is quite a bit of interest in the property owned by the LDS Church that has recently come up for sale.

Thompson logging has a new contract with the Beaver Mountain area so the saw mill will continue to be busy.

Melanie presented her budget for the Easter Egg Hunt. The prizes will be better than ever this year due to increased sponsorship. She has also purchased some signs that can be used for several years. She has received some help from the Youth Council with the egg preparation and will be needing the sound system.

The scholarship requirements have been set and presented to Jode Muir. The applications will be due on May 1 and we will decide on May 10 who our winners are.

A local resident had expressed concern about some dogs in the town not being properly cared for. Although she was not at the meeting, the board agreed that she should be told to contact the Rich County Sheriff's office for animal control and abuse matters.

We discussed changing the way our T-ball program is managed and having players hit the ball strictly off the tee instead of coach pitch. The discussion also included a new pitching machine that could be used with younger children. The Mayor will look into this and there may be some modifications made this summer as the program moves on.

We have a couple of ideas for Eagle Scout Projects if anyone is interested.

We are also trying to make a selection for our softball scoreboard, benches, and lights.

We will be discussing the Budget in our May meeting as well.

Melanie made the motion to adjourn and Bridget seconded at 8:40 pm.
