Mayor Weston called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

It was noted that attorney Bill Morris had emailed and said he had no further information on the county/town agreement. He had not been able to contact the county attorney.

The minutes from last month's meeting were discussed as the first item on the agenda. They were moved to be approved by Melanie with Sim seconding, approved unanimously.

The fallen tree damage to the Wilford Woodruff house was discussed. We have the report from the people that Beth Sano asked to assist us with assessing the damage. They gave recommendations on how we should proceed with the repairs and stated that they thought we should do at least a shoring up before winter snows came.

Melanie attempted to contact Bret Argyle for his recommendation and possible assistance with this matter. It was reported that someone??? had run some cables to assist with the stability of the structure. We are not sure who that may be.

We discussed the report generated by ULGT concerning safety issues with our shop and playground. Scott was working on these items presently. He and Lana will work together to document when each item is repaired. Brian moved to approve purchase of a gas and paint storage cabinet to met those requirements and Melanie seconded, approved unanimously.

Lana read the bills. Sim asked if all the work had been completed on the new pump. The Mayor assured him that it had been done to our satisfaction before we paid their invoice.

The invoice for tree trimming has been received and the tourism grant money applied for from the county. We should be receiving it soon and be reimbursed for our new tree expenses and tree trimming.

The Mayor informed the board that the money we had left over from our Covid allotment was going to be turned over to the county where they would add it to a pot to help small businesses impacted by Covid 19 in the county. They would administer the application process and distribute the funds from not only Randolph but other communities in the county.

The approach to the subdivision and the new bridges had been delayed by the weather. We will work on both of these as soon as spring arrives.

Melanie reported that she has been working on Sub for Santa and will be assisted by Jeannie Limb. She has a list of people needing holiday help and has started accepting donations. Angel trees will soon be added and the Mayor gave her some names of people wishing to help. She will need the board to assist with delivery of gifts.

The Christmas Eve party was discussed. Brittany Miller is organizing a possible caroling event by the Baptist church. The board felt it was a tradition that we wanted to continue even with Covid restrictions. We discussed ways to make it safer, for example, having one family at a time, no contact with Santa, only individually wrapped candies. We will continue with making plans to see that it is carried on.

The Town party usually held at Bon Rico's was discussed. Melanie expressed her desire to support local businesses and had a bid from the Trough for a Prime Rib dinner. The Mayor believed that this dinner was seen as an expression of thanks from the town to the people that give of their time to make it run. He thought that Bon Rico was a special place to go and very few visited it except for our party. It was a time to say thank you for all you do for us. After some discussion, it was agreed that the party would continue to be held at Bon Rico, but no gift certificates would be issued if anyone was unable to attend.

Sim made the motion to dismiss and Brian seconded at 8:30 pm, approved unanimously.
