

**RANDOLPH TOWN BOARD MEETING**

Mayor Weston called the meeting to order at 7:40 pm. First on our agenda for tonight was Mike Weibel and Joe Stocking representing Bear Lake Responds. Mr. Weibel gave us an overview of what his organization does. It is a partner of CERT, certified emergency response teams or an organization of volunteers, both trained and untrained, that are willing to be on call and contacted if there is an emergency situation of any kind in the Bear Lake Area. Mr. Weibel would like to see this service expanded to our end of the county and have people, including local leaders, volunteer their services for this cause. The name could be changed to Rich County responders if necessary. He left his phone number with us 435-994-1122 to reach him at any time.

At this time, he also put a plug in for the Bear River Health Department and mentioned that they provide many services besides just vaccinations, ie, food handlers permits, substance abuse counseling, child safety projects, WIC, along with the regular nursing and safety services.

Dan Ames was given the floor in the meeting next. He had prepared and completed the CWP Plan and returned it to us for signature. Because Brian Weyers was not in attendance and his name was on the document, Lana will have to obtain his signature and send the completed report to Dan.

Ryan Crompton had come to our meeting to discuss the purchase of water from the town for different services his company provides. He has been watering some local arenas with ditch water, but would like to be able to use his truck for that purpose and also to provide water to Richardson Oil and possibly the Forest Service. He would be taking 4000 gallons at a time and has a backflow preventer in place on his truck.

The board asked several questions of Ryan, including the timeline on the water sale. He stated it would be seasonal use. They advised him that the matter would be discussed and

we would prepare a memorandum for his signature. We would be letting him know of our decision.

The Mayor then addressed the guests at our meeting that were here to discuss the upcoming Car show at the Rich County Fair. He reminded them that he was in charge of the meeting, and they would only be allowed to speak in an organized fashion. The issue of the car show was considered a finalized matter to the town board and none of the people there had made arrangements to be on the agenda.

He once again expressed the town's support of Jared Huffaker and all the good he is doing through his car shows. We did, however, continue to have some safety and organizational concerns. The proximity of the playground was of main concern along with congestion.

Jared was asked to speak and commented that he had raised \$50,000 in the eight years he had been doing car shows. All of them until last year at the fair had been held in Woodruff. He commented that the shows keep getting bigger and bigger and he sees no limit to their productivity. He does not like drama surrounding this event, but continued to tout his car show accomplishments.

The Mayor stated that another day, besides during the Rich County Fair or at another venue in town would be much less crowded and confusing. Jared replied that then he would not have the fair crowds. He encouraged Jared to continue discussions with the fair board for next year. He was reminded that the town gave him choices where he would like to have the cars parked at our March meeting and he chose the street over the park's north side. Those options would still be considered, but not in the place they were parked last year.

Jack Bell was invited to speak and he commented that the cars didn't really hurt the grass or sprinklers at the park. He had seen other motorized vehicles in there. He felt we could move the bounce houses to make room for the cars.

Clayton Webb commented on believing that the park actually belonged to America, not just Randolph and was pleased with Jared for honoring veterans.

Laurel Telford complained about not being given notice when decisions were made for the town, although all regulations were followed on advertisement of public meetings. He also had a written presentation for board members.

The Mayor once again expressed his and the town's support for this worthy cause. The board was willing to sponsor a trophy given to one of his participants. We wish the best for those affected by devastating disease, and encourage Jared to continue working along with the Rich County Fair board for some different planning next year.

At this point most of the guests left.

We discussed the new access road for the subdivision. At this point, we are still working with the county, and hoping to have their help.

Sim also stated that he has been measuring streets around town. We encouraged him to do this and see if we could access some more B&C Road funding.

Mayor Weston mentioned Jared Davis's water bill that was now over \$600. He felt that because they moved to correct it so quickly, we could make an adjustment on their account to about the same amount as they usually pay in the summertime. The board agreed and thought that there was a possibility Jared could do the town a favor sometime with some of his heavy equipment. Melanie made this motion and Sim seconded.

Saturday's breakfast will be at 8:00. Please come at 7:00 pm to start. Monday's movie in the park went well and the fair is moving along this week.

Melanie had followed through with questions to the superintendent of schools concerning safe routes for schools. We have missed the grant deadline this year, but hope to get the district motivated to help us get some sidewalk funding for next year.

She had also been talking with Out on a Limb Tree Services. They stated that we could possibly get a lower rate if we waited until late fall or winter to remove our trees.

The minutes from last month's meeting were moved to be approved by Sim with Melanie seconding, approved unanimously. Then Lana read the bills and Sim moved to approve with Larry seconding, approved unanimously.

We moved on to discussion about Ryan Crompton's water application. Melanie stated that she believed that it should only be approved if we stated it could not be used on the arenas (because it had already been established that they had used ditch water) and had an ending date. The board felt that it was important that a representative of the town was there every time he took water to monitor the meter and back flow devices.

Lana will compose a MOA stating these stipulations and we will give it to Ryan for signature. Melanie made this motion and Sim seconded. Larry was on record as opposing any sale of water.

Melanie made the motion that we dismiss at 10:30 pm, Larry seconded, approved unanimously.
