

Materials

5/8 yard	Novelty Stripe - Multi (A)	6976G-39
1/8 yard	Pumpkins - Black (B)	6967G-99
1/8 yard	Stripe - Orange/Black (C)	6971G-39
1/2 yard	Eyes - Black (D)	6970G-99
1/4 yard	Spider Web - Orange (E)	6974G-33

You will also need:

- 1/2 yard of Fusible Fleece

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

From the Novelty Stripe - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (2) 18 1/2" wide x 9 1/2" high stripe from Length of Fabric (LOF), position the stripes 1/4" above the top orange star stripe and 2 1/4" below the tombstone stripe (Fig. 1).



Cut a 1/4" above the orange stars and 2 1/4" below the Tombstone border to cut 9 1/2" x 18 1/2" Fabric A

From the Pumpkins - Black (B), cut:

- (1) 3 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into (2) 3 1/2" x 18 1/2" strips.

From the Stripe- Orange/Black (C), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into (2) 2 1/2" x 18 1/2" strips.

From the Eyes - Black (D), cut:

- (1) 14 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut into (2) 14 1/2" x 18 1/2" strips for the lining.

From the Spider Web - Orange (E), cut:

- (2) 4" x WOF strips

From the Fusible Fleece, cut:

- (2) 1 x 40" strips for the handles (**Cut First**)
- (2) 14 1/2" x 18 1/2" pieces for the bag (**Cut Second**)

Sewing Instructions

1. Follow Figure 2 to sew together (1) 18 1/2" x 9 1/2" Fabric A strip and (1) 18 1/2" x 3 1/2" Fabric B strip and (1) 18 1/2" x 2 1/2" Fabric C strip to make the outer bag front. Repeat to make the outer bag back.



2. Following the manufacturer's instructions and press one piece of Fusible Fleece to the wrong side of each the outer bag front and outer bag back. Quilt as desired.
3. Place the bag front and bag back right sides together. Stitch down the two short sides and across the bottom.
4. Measure in from the side edge 2 1/4" and up from the bottom edge 2 1/4" at each bottom corner. Cut out the square of fabric (Fig. 3). Open the cut bottom and align the bottom edge with the side edge and sew the two edges together (Fig. 4). Repeat with the other bottom corner to make the box bottom.





5. Place the two Fabric D lining pieces right sides together. Stitch down the two short sides and across the bottom, leaving a 4" opening for turning.

6. Repeat Step 4 to the sewn lining to make the box bottom in the lining.

7. To make the handles, fold one 4" x WOF Fabric E strip in half lengthwise and press (Fig. 5). Open the folded fabric and fold each long edge to the creased centerline and press (Fig. 6). Fold the pressed fabric in half again and press to make one 1" x WOF strip to make one folded handle (Fig. 7). Press one piece of fusible fleece inside the folded handle (Fig. 7). Press one piece of fusible fleece inside the folded handle.

8. Top stitch down both long sides 1/8" in from the edge to make the handle strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second handle.







9. Cut the handle strips to desired length to make two handles.

10. Pin one handle to the front of the bag measuring 4" in from each side seam (Fig. 9). Repeat with the second handle and bag back. Make sure the handles are hanging down the right side of the bag while assembling.



11. Place the bag with handles, right sides together with the lining, aligning the top raw edges of the bag, handles and lining and pin together. Sew the lining and bag together, reinforcing the stitching at each handle end. Turn the bag and lining right side out through the opening in the lining. Press as needed and top stitch the opening closed. Put the lining into the bag, aligning the sides and bottom.
