Class Title	Seminole Patchwork Sampler
Type of Class	Workshop with Machines – technique & project
Time needed	6-8 hours
Student Limit	20
Classroom Equipment	machines with 1/4" foot, rotary mats and cutters, ironing boards and irons
Class Description	Learn seven different Seminole patchwork techniques while you create a beautiful wall size quilt sampler. Seminole patchwork allows you to create complex pieced bands or blocks using easy strip piecing techniques. You will make 3 different Seminole bands in class and receive instructions for 4 more in class. Use these techniques to create spectacular borders on your next quilt project.
Benefits of Class	Learn a new technique which has multiple applications in block and border construction.  Construct a beautiful sampler wall quilt for a special space or as a gift.  Learn the cultural background of this beautiful art created by the Seminole Indians of Florida as part of their garment tradition, which still endures today.
Supplies Needed	<ul> <li>Fabric: 1 yard solid black pimatex, 12 bright FQs in solids, tonals, batiks or marbles.</li> <li>Basic sewing supplies.</li> <li>Thin pins</li> <li>60-80 weight black or gray thread</li> <li>70/10 machine needle</li> </ul>
