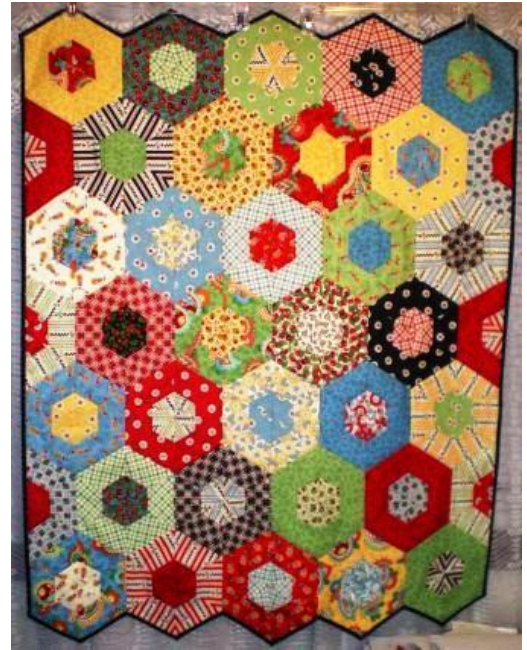


Merry Go Round Quilt

- *Sizzlin' Sixties* by Anka's Treasures, by Heather Mulder Peterson. **Books are for sale at the workshop for \$14.00**
- 60° Ruler is required. (Tri-Recs ruler will NOT work). I recommend From Marti Michell™ Small 60° Triangle Ruler. **I will have these for sale for \$14.00**
- **Book/Ruler Combo available for \$25.**
- 1 Jelly Roll for a lap quilt (any fabric line you like will work). This is the size shown in the picture at right. [37 ½" x 48"]
- 2 Jelly Rolls for a large throw (should all be from the same fabric line). [52" x 61"]
- 3 Jelly Rolls for a small bed size quilt [61 ¾" x 68"]
- Appropriately sized piece of backing and batting for the size of quilt you plan to make.
- Matching or contrasting fabric for binding. Amount will depend on size of your quilt.



If you want to use fabric from your stash cut forty 2 ½" x Width of Fabric [WOF] strips to equal one Jelly Roll. Each fabric should be different or at most no more than 2 strips of each fabric. A more controlled design is achieved by selecting fewer fabrics, but this pattern is most appealing because of its "scrappy" look. _____

Also bring:

- Sewing machine in good working order with an accurate ¼" foot or seam guide.
- Basic sewing supplies.
- Rotary cutter with new blade and cutting matt, & 4 x 12 or 6 x 12 acrylic ruler
- Neutral cotton thread, or thread to match your fabric
- Scissors
- Sharp pins (thin pins are best for this project)
- Iron and ironing surface
- Portable Design Wall. This can be easily made by taking a piece of poster-sized foam core board and securing a piece of white felt, flannel, vinyl tablecloth with flannel backing, or piece of batting on the board, pulling the edges of the cloth around to the back and taping them down securely. An inexpensive flannel-backed vinyl tablecloth also works great, and can be rolled up with blocks at the end of class. (for full day class only)
