1. MEETING CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Cutler called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

3. APPROVAL OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES HELD JANUARY 3rd, 2023:

- Present City Council Members reviewed the minutes from November 15, 2022.
- Council Member Bell motioned to approve the City Council Meeting minutes for November 15, 2022.
- Council Member Boothe seconded the motion.
- Mayor Cutler asked if there was any discussion on the motion; there was none.

4. TREASURERS REPORT:

Presenter: Mike Ulrich

a) Invoice Register -- November and December 2022

- Council Member Roberts made the motion to approve the invoice register for November 1-30, 2022.
- Council Member Bell seconded the motion.

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b) Transaction Register and Adjustments -- November 2022

Mr. Ulrich explained that this was just a transfer between accounts for Scenic Development.

c) Budget

- Mr. Ulrich pointed out that in November in the water fund, there is a negative amount for water sales. In October, the amount of sales doubled due to a resident being overbilled \$32,000. It was corrected in November. The number year to date is correct, but it looks funny. In December our property taxes came in and the numbers were strong. Our sales and use tax is still looking good. At the end of December, which is halfway through budget, we are at 63% so we are a little ahead.
- Business licenses will start coming in this month and next.
- Interest rates have gone up to 5-6% so we are doing really well in the PTIF funds. Council Member Bell asked about the amount in funds to be appropriated in the garbage fund. Mr. Ulrich Explained that we

are still to the good. Council Member Bell explained that we know that they are going to raise the dump rates so we will be looking at increasing our fees to help cover those costs.

5. DISCUSSION/ACTION ON ORDINANCE 273-23 NUISANCE; AN ORDINANCE OF THE UINTAH CITY COUNCIL RELATING TO NUISANCES.

Presenter: Council Member Boothe

- Council Member Boothe made a motion to table Ordinance 273-23 NUISANCE.
- Council Member Roberts seconded the motion to table.

6. PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:

Presenter: Jeff Holden

- Mr. Holden stated that we have been out twenty-five times so far this year to plow snow. Last year we went out a total of twenty-five times. Last year we had fifty-six inches of snow and so far, this year, we are at 57 inches.
- Because of all the rain, we have had a lot of potholes. We have gone through a lot of cold patch to fix those. There will be some that we will have to fix next summer. I did take the tractor down 6600 to get some of the ponds off the sides of the road because the water starts to eat at the sides of the road.
- The cemetery got cleaned up last week and we picked up the wreaths and crosses that were out there.
- The turbo sensor on our new Dodge went out but it was covered under warranty. It threw another code this morning that had to do with the coolant, but we got that fixed as well.

7. SHERIFF'S REPORT:

Presenter: Lt. Ryan

- Lt. Ryan stated that over the last quarter the Weber County Sherriff's Office had our first annual trunk or treat which brought out a big turnout. We also had shop with a hero. This event is a Bonneville High School seniors' tradition to raise money, which was close to \$18,000 and then the officers take kids shopping. We had 90 kids throughout Weber County that we shopped with. Our Christmas event was held at the Weber County Fairgrounds in one of their buildings and we had hot chocolate and pictures with Santa. We also did a community luncheon with all our Community partners.
- Council Member Roberts mentioned that she appreciated the new reports with all the calls. Lt. Ryan explained that he is working on reports to be personalized for Uintah City which will be easier to read.
- Mayor Cutler mentioned that it is interesting to see what is going on within our City and to see where the calls are at. We want to be able to help those within our City. Lt. Ryan mentioned that we have a policy that is see something, say something where people can send us an email or there is Safe Utah which people can use to report issues.
- Mayor Cutler asked if the Sheriff's office has been briefed on what is happening on Highway 89. Lt. Ryan mentioned that he has not seen those plans. Mayor Cutler stated that if you have any input, you might mention that the bridges ice over, as they are looking at doing a double decker bridge.
- Mayor Cutler thanked Lt. Ryan for all his hard work and the other officers as well.


